Lesson #149: “The Sermon on the Mount”, Part 3

Matthew 5:5-6 (KJV)

Blessed [are] the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed [are] they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.

Isaiah 57:18 (KJV) I have seen his ways, and will heal him: I will lead him also, and restore comforts unto him and to his mourners.

Jeremiah 31:13 (KJV) Then shall the virgin rejoice in the dance, both young men and old together: for I will turn their mourning into joy, and will comfort them, and make them rejoice from their sorrow.

Psalms 138:6 (KJV) Though the LORD [be] high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly: but the proud he knoweth afar off.

Revelations 7:15 (KJV) Therefore are they before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple: and he that sitteth on the throne shall dwell among them.

Exodus 34:6 (KJV) And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth,

Psalms 119:165 (KJV) Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them.

God's word for the sorrowing is, "I have seen his ways, and will heal him: I will lead him also, and restore comforts unto him and to his mourners." "I will turn their mourning into joy, and will comfort them, and make them rejoice from their sorrow." **Isaiah 57:18; Jeremiah 31:13. {DA 301.2}**

"Blessed are the meek." The difficulties we have to encounter may be very much lessened by that meekness which hides itself in Christ. If we possess the humility of our Master, we shall rise above the slights, the rebuffs, the annoyances, to which we are daily exposed, and they will cease to cast a gloom over the spirit. The highest evidence of nobility in a Christian is self-control. He who under abuse or cruelty fails to maintain a calm and trustful spirit robs God of His right to reveal in him His own perfection of character. Lowliness of heart is the strength that gives victory to the followers of Christ; it is the token of their connection with the courts above. **{DA 301.3}**

Question: What is God's word for the sorrowing? And, what is the highest evidence of nobility in a Christian.

Answer: "I have seen his ways, and will heal him: I will lead him also, and restore comforts unto him and to his mourners." "I will turn their mourning into joy, and will comfort them, and make them rejoice from their sorrow." And, the highest evidence of nobility is self-control.

"Though the Lord be high, yet hath He respect unto the lowly." **Psalm 138:6.** Those who reveal the meek and lowly spirit of Christ are tenderly regarded by God. They may be looked upon with scorn by the world, but they are of great value in His sight. Not only the wise, the great, the beneficent, will gain a passport to the heavenly courts; not only the busy worker, full of zeal and restless activity. No; the poor in spirit, who crave the presence of an abiding Christ, the humble in heart, whose highest ambition is to do God's will,--these will gain an abundant entrance. They will be among that number who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. "Therefore are they before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple: and He that sitteth on the throne shall dwell among them." **Revelation 7:15. {DA 301.4}**

Question: Who will gain an abundant entrance and a passport to the heavenly courts? And where will the poor in spirit and humble of heart be found?

Answer: The poor in spirit, who crave the presence of an abiding Christ, the humble in heart, whose highest ambition is to do God's will. And, they will be among that number who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

"Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness." The sense of unworthiness will lead the heart to hunger and thirst for righteousness, and this desire will not be disappointed. Those who make room in their hearts for Jesus will realize His love. All who long to bear the likeness of the character of God shall be satisfied. The Holy Spirit never leaves unassisted the soul who is looking unto Jesus. He takes of the things of Christ and shows them unto him. If the eye is kept fixed on Christ, the work of the Spirit ceases not until the soul is conformed to His image. The pure element of love will expand the soul, giving it a capacity for higher attainments, for increased knowledge of heavenly things, so that it will not rest short of the fullness. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness; for they shall be filled." {DA 302.1}

Question: Does the Holy Spirit ever leave unassisted the soul who is looking unto Jesus? And, what will be result of the pure element of love in the soul?

Answer: No! He takes of the things of Christ and shows them unto him. If the eye is kept fixed on Christ, the work of the Spirit ceases not until the soul is conformed to His image. And love will expand giving it a capacity for higher attainments, for increased knowledge of heavenly things, so that it will not rest short of the fullness.

The merciful shall find mercy, and the pure in heart shall see God. Every impure thought defiles the soul, impairs the moral sense, and tends to obliterate the impressions of the Holy Spirit. It dims the spiritual vision, so that men cannot behold God. The Lord may and does forgive the repenting sinner; but though forgiven, the soul is marred. All impurity of speech or of thought must be shunned by him who would have clear discernment of spiritual truth.
{DA 302.2}

Question: What tends to obliterate the impressions of the Holy Spirit? And, by whom must all impurity of speech or of thought be shunned by?

Answer: Every impure thought defiles the soul, impairs the moral sense. It dims the spiritual vision, so that men cannot behold God. And, by him who would have clear discernment of spiritual truth.

But the words of Christ cover more than freedom from sensual impurity, more than freedom from that ceremonial defilement which the Jews so rigorously shunned. Selfishness prevents us from beholding God. The self-seeking spirit judges of God as altogether such a one as itself. Until we have renounced this, we cannot understand Him who is love. Only the unselfish heart, the humble and trustful spirit, shall see God as “merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth.” **Exodus 34:6. {DA 302.3}**

Question: What must be renounced or we cannot understand Him who is love? And, who are the only ones that shall see God as “merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth?”

Answer: Selfishness and self-seeking spirit judges of God. And, the unselfish heart, the humble and trustful spirit.

“Blessed are the peacemakers.” The peace of Christ is born of truth. It is harmony with God. The world is at enmity with the law of God; sinners are at enmity with their Maker; and as a result they are at enmity with one another. But the psalmist declares, “Great peace have they which love Thy law: and nothing shall offend them.” Psalm 119:165. Men cannot manufacture peace. Human plans for the purification and uplifting of individuals or of society will fail of producing peace, because they do not reach the heart. The only power that can create or perpetuate true peace is the grace of Christ. When this is implanted in the heart, it will cast out the evil passions that cause strife and dissension. “Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree, and instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree;” and life's desert “shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose.” **Isaiah 55:13; 35:1. {DA 302.4}.**

Question: Who shall have great peace and nothing shall offend them? And, Can men manufacture peace?

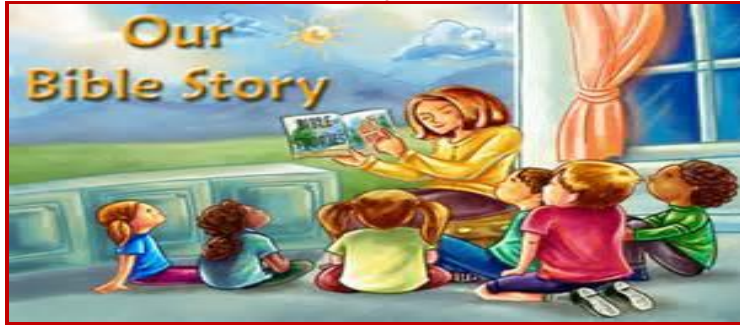

Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbour's. Exodus 20:17. {SD 65.1}

The last commandment condemns **covetousness**. Every selfish desire, every degree of **discontent**, every act of overreaching, every selfish **gratification** works to the strengthening and developing of a character which will destroy the Christlikeness of the human agent, and close the gates of the city of God against him. {SD 65.2}

When . . . angels come to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation, and witness the **exhibition** of selfishness, of covetousness, of overreaching, and benefiting self at others' **disadvantage**, they turn away in grief. . . . In no way could the Lord be better glorified and the truth more highly honored, than for unbelievers to see that the truth has wrought a great and good work upon the lives of naturally covetous and **penurious** men. If it could be seen that the faith of such had an influence to mold their characters, to change them from close, **selfish**, overreaching, money-loving men, to men who love to do good, who seek opportunities to use their means to bless those who need to be blessed, who visit the widow and fatherless in their **affliction**, and who keep themselves **unspotted** from the world, it would be an **evidence** that their religion was genuine. . . . Those who profess to be waiting and watching for the appearing of their Lord should not **disgrace** their profession by bantering in deal and standing for the last penny. Such fruit does not grow upon the Christian tree. {SD 65.3}

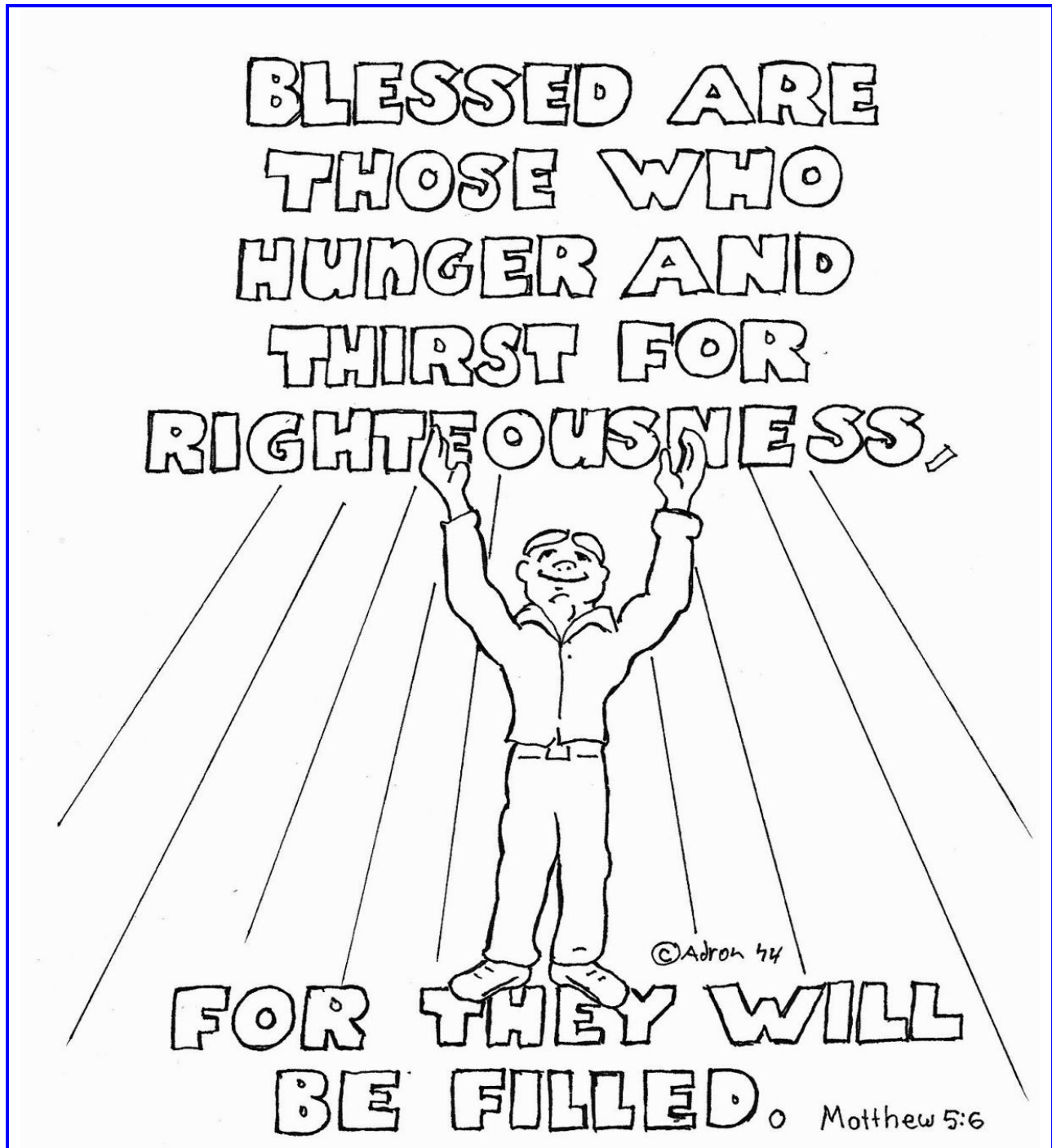
The tenth commandment strikes at the very root of all sins, **prohibiting** the selfish desire, from which springs the sinful act. He who in obedience to God's law refrains from indulging even a sinful desire for that which belongs to another, will not be guilty of an act of wrong toward his fellow-creatures. {SD 65.4}

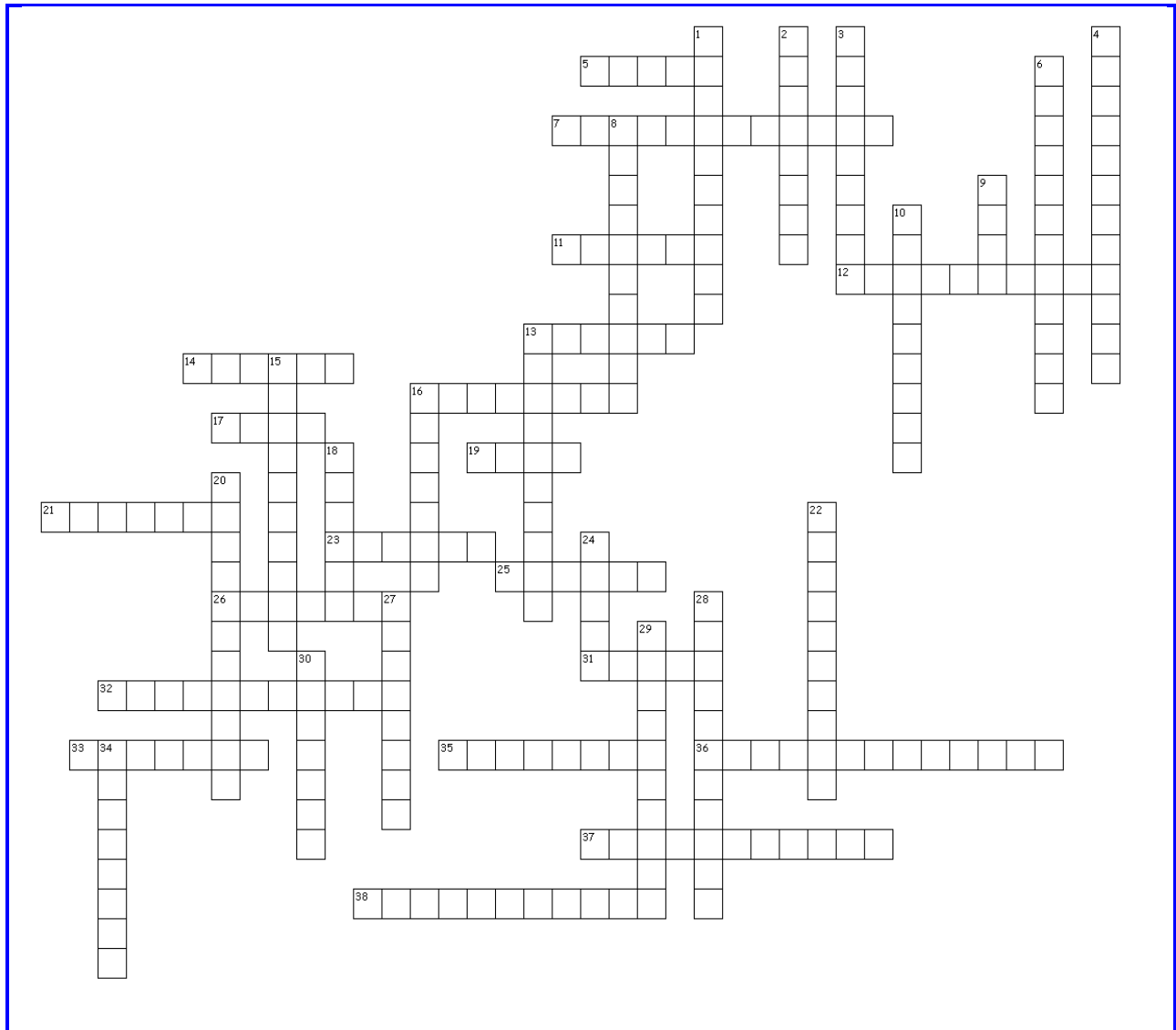
