Lesson #287 “The Feast at Simon’s House” Part 6

Luke 7:44 (KJV)

And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped [them] with the hairs of her head.

Let's continue in our book Desire of Ages, Chapter #62, pages 566- 567

As did Nathan with David, Christ concealed His home thrust under the veil of a parable. He threw upon His host the burden of pronouncing sentence upon himself. Simon had led into sin the woman he now despised. She had been deeply wronged by him. By the two debtors of the parable, Simon and the woman were represented. Jesus did not design to teach that different degrees of obligation should be felt by the two persons, for each owed a debt of gratitude that never could be repaid. But Simon felt himself more righteous than Mary, and Jesus desired him to see how great his guilt really was. He would show him that his sin was greater than hers, as much greater as a debt of five hundred pence exceeds a debt of fifty pence. {DA 566.5}

Question: What did Christ conceal with His home thrust under the veil of a parable as did Nathan with David? And, what did He desire Simon to see and show him as well?

Answer: By the two debtors of the parable Simon and the woman were represented; for each owed a debt of gratitude that never could be repaid. And, Jesus desired him to see how great his guilt really was. He would show him that his sin was greater than hers.

Question: What did Simon began to see in himself and in Mary? Also, what did he see with keen prophetic eyes that brought shame upon him?

Answer: Simon now began to see himself in a new light. He saw how Mary was regarded by One who was more than a prophet. And, he saw Christ read her heart of love and devotion. Shame seized upon him, and he realized that he was in the presence of One superior to himself.

“I entered into thine house,” Christ continued, “thou gavest Me no water for My feet;” but with tears of repentance, prompted by love, Mary hath washed My feet, and wiped them with the hair of her head. “Thou gavest Me no kiss: but this woman,” whom you despise, “since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss My feet.”

Christ recounted the opportunities Simon had had to show his love for his Lord, and his appreciation of what had been done for him. Plainly, yet with delicate politeness, the Saviour assured His disciples that His heart is grieved when His children neglect to show their gratitude to Him by words and deeds of love. {DA 567.2}

Question: What did Christ state to Simon after He said, “I entered into thine house?” And, how did the Saviour assured His disciples that His heart is grieved when His children neglect to show their gratitude to Him by words and deeds of love?

Answer: Christ continued, “thou gavest Me no water for My feet;” but with tears of repentance, prompted by love, Mary hath washed My feet, and wiped them with the hair of her head. “Thou gavest Me no kiss: but this woman,” whom you despise, “since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss My feet.” And, plainly, yet with delicate politeness!

The Heart Searcher read the motive that led to Mary's action, and He saw also the spirit that prompted Simon's words. “Seest thou this woman?” He said to him. Answer: He read the motive that led to Mary's action, and He saw also the spirit that prompted Simon's words. And, He said, “Seest thou this woman?” He said to him. She is a sinner. “I say unto thee, her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little.”

Simon's coldness and neglect toward the Saviour showed how little he appreciated the mercy he had received. He had thought he honored Jesus by inviting Him to his house. But he now saw himself as he really was. While he thought himself reading his Guest, his Guest had been reading him. He saw how true Christ's judgment of him was. His religion had been a robe of Pharisaism. He had despised the compassion of Jesus. He had not recognized Him as the representative of God. While Mary was a sinner pardoned, he was a sinner unpardoned. The rigid rule of justice he had desired to enforce against her condemned him. {DA 567.4}

Question: What two things in Simon demonstrate toward the Saviour to show how little he appreciated the mercy he had received and why? Also, how did he see himself after Christ read his heart?

Answer: Simon's coldness and neglect. He had thought he honored Jesus by inviting Him to his house. And, he saw how true Christ's judgment of him was. His religion had been a robe of Pharisaism, not recognizing Him as the representative of God.

Simon was touched by the kindness of Jesus in not openly rebuking him before the guests. He had not been treated as he desired Mary to be treated. He saw that Jesus did not wish to expose his guilt to others, but sought by a true statement of the case to convince his mind, and by pitying kindness to subdue his heart. Stern denunciation would have hardened Simon against repentance, but patient admonition convinced him of his error. He saw the magnitude of the debt which he owed his Lord. His pride was humbled, he repented, and the proud Pharisee became a lowly, self-sacrificing disciple. {DA 567.5}

Question: How was Simon touched by Jesus and why hadn't he been treated as he desired Mary to be treated? Also, what did he not see Jesus do; but sought by a true statement of the case to convince his mind?

Answer: He was touch by the kindness of Jesus in not openly rebuking him before the guests. He saw that Jesus did not wish to expose his guilt to others, but sought by a true statement of the case to convince his mind, and by pitying kindness to subdue his heart.

Chapter 7-God Calls Youth Because They Are Strong

I have written unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I have written unto you, young men, because ye are strong, and the word of God abideth in you, and ye have overcome the wicked one. 1 John 2:14. {SD 204.1}

These words of **approval** and instruction are addressed to every young man who has put on the whole armor of righteousness. Young and strong, they may do giant strokes for God, if they will make God their only trust. The older ones who are addressed as “fathers,” have a decided work to do in holding up the standard: but they feel the pressure of the burdens of life, and it is fitting that the younger ones should be encouraged to **qualify** themselves for duty by **obtaining** an experience in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, so that as the **standard** falls from the fathers, the strong young men may **grasp** it, and bear it **aloft**. . . . {SD 204.2}

There are many young men in this age who will search the Scriptures as for hidden treasures, and having found jewels of truth, will open up the treasures of the word to the minds of others. . . . “Ye are strong” **comprehends** more than mere **physical** strength. It means that the mind has been trained to think, and has been kept clear and strong by the practice of strictly **temperate** habits. It means that the young men have engaged with **earnestness**, and have overcome the enemy, connecting the religion of Jesus Christ with every-day life, and bringing Christ into their every-day duties and enjoyments. It means that they have become partakers of the divine nature. {SD 204.3}

Youth who have given themselves to the service of God, are in a position to fight **manfully** the battles of the Lord. Let the youth take Christ as their pattern, and they will do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with their God. They will then be strong. {SD 204.4}

Character will be tested. . . .Day by day and year by year we shall conquer self and develop a noble **heroism**.. {SD 204.5}




