Lesson #289 "Thy King Cometh"

Matthew 21:5 (KJV)

Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.

This Sabbath boys and girls, we will begin a new chapter of our lesson entitle, "Thy King Cometh" in our lesson book, Desire of Ages!

Matthew 21:1 (KJV)

And when they drew nigh unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of Olives, then sent Jesus two disciples,

Matthew 21:2 (KJV)

Saying unto them, Go into the village over against you, and straightway ye shall find an ass tied, and a colt with her: loose [them], and bring [them] unto me.

Matthew 21:3 (KJV)

And if any [man] say ought unto you, ye shall say, The Lord hath need of them; and straightway he will send them.

Matthew 21:4 (KJV) All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying,

Matthew 21:6 (KJV) And the disciples went, and did as Jesus commanded them,

Matthew 21:7 (KJV) And brought the ass, and the colt, and put on them their clothes, and they set [him] thereon.

Matthew 21:8 (KJV)

And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strowed [them] in the way.

Matthew 21:9 (KJV)

And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the son of David: Blessed [is] he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.

Let's continue in our book Desire of Ages, Chapter #63, pages 569-570

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: He is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass." **Zechariah 9:9. {DA 569.1**}

Five hundred years before the birth of Christ, the prophet Zechariah thus foretold the coming of the King to Israel. This prophecy is now to be fulfilled. He who has so long refused royal honors now comes to Jerusalem as the promised heir to David's throne. {**DA 569.2**}

Question: What did the prophet Zechariah say about the King that was to come? Also, when was this prophecy was foretold by him?

Answer: He is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass." Zechariah 9:9. And, Five hundred years before the birth of Christ, the prophet Zechariah thus foretold the coming of the King to Israel.

It was on the first day of the week that Christ made His triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Multitudes who had flocked to see Him at Bethany now accompanied Him, eager to witness His reception. Many people were on their way to the city to keep the Passover, and these joined the multitude attending Jesus. All nature seemed to rejoice. The trees were clothed with verdure, and their blossoms shed a delicate fragrance on the air. A new life and joy animated the people. The hope of the new kingdom was again springing up. **{DA 569.3}**

Question: When did Jesus make His triumphal entry into Jerusalem? Also, why were so many people on their way to the city?

Answer: It was on the first day of the week Multitudes who had flocked to see Him at Bethany now accompanied Him, eager to witness His reception. And, many people were on their way to the city to keep the Passover, and these joined the multitude attending Jesus.

Purposing to ride into Jerusalem, Jesus had sent two of His disciples to bring to Him an ass and its colt. At His birth the Saviour was dependent upon the hospitality of strangers. The manger in which He lay was a borrowed resting place. Now, although the cattle on a thousand hills are His, He is dependent on a stranger's kindness for an animal on which to enter Jerusalem as its King. But again His divinity is revealed, even in the minute directions given His disciples for this errand. As He foretold, the plea, "The Lord hath need of them," was readily granted. Jesus chose for His use the colt on which never man had sat. The disciples, with glad enthusiasm, spread their garments on the beast, and seated their Master upon it. Heretofore Jesus had always traveled on foot, and the disciples had at first wondered that He should now choose to ride. But hope brightened in their hearts with the joyous thought that He was about to enter the capital, proclaim Himself King, and assert His royal power. While on their errand they communicated their glowing expectations to the friends of Jesus, and the excitement spread far and near, raising the expectations of the people to the highest pitch. {DA 569.4}

Question: What did Jesus sent two of His disciples to do as He was purposing to ride into Jerusalem? Also, what was Jesus dependent upon at His birth as well as He was to enter Jerusalem as its King?

Answer: He sent two of His disciples to bring to Him an ass and its colt. And, the Saviour was dependent upon the hospitality of strangers, which was shown by their kindness for an animal. The manger in which He lay was a borrowed resting place.

Question: What was the plea He (Jesus) had foretold that was readily granted, even in the minute directions given His disciples for this errand? Also, why did the disciples wonder in surprise?

Answer: "The Lord hath need of them," Jesus chose for His use the colt on which never man had sat. And, Heretofore Jesus had always traveled on foot, and the disciples had at first wondered that He should now choose to ride.

Christ was following the Jewish custom for a royal entry. The animal on which He rode was that ridden by the kings of Israel, and prophecy had foretold that thus the Messiah should come to His kingdom. No sooner was He seated upon the colt than a loud shout of triumph rent the air. The multitude hailed Him as Messiah, their King. Jesus now accepted the homage which He had never before permitted, and the disciples received this as proof that their glad hopes were to be realized by seeing Him established on the throne. The multitude were convinced that the hour of their emancipation was at hand. In imagination they saw the Roman armies driven from Jerusalem, and Israel once more an independent nation. All were happy and excited; the people vied with one another in paying Him homage. They could not display outward pomp and splendor, but they gave Him the worship of happy hearts. They were unable to present Him with costly gifts, but they spread their outer garments as a carpet in His path, and they also strewed the leafy branches of the olive and the palm in the way. They could lead the triumphal procession with no royal standards, but they cut down the spreading palm boughs, Nature's emblem of victory, and waved them aloft with loud acclamations and hosannas. {DA 570.1}

Question: How was Christ following the Jewish custom for a royal entry? Also, what had happen no sooner than He was seated upon the colt?

Answer: The animal on which He rode was that ridden by the kings of Israel, and prophecy had foretold that thus the Messiah should come to His kingdom. And, a loud shout of triumph rent the air and the multitude hailed Him as Messiah, their King.

Question: Did Jesus accept the homage, which He had never before permitted and why? Also, what was the multitude convinced of, and what did they see in their imagination with the scene?

Answer: Yes! The disciples received this as proof that their glad hopes were to be realized by seeing Him established on the throne. And, that the hour of their emancipation was at hand. In imagination they saw the Roman armies driven from Jerusalem, and Israel once more an independent nation.

Our book selection this Sabbath is entitle, "Sons and Daughters of God" Chapter 7-Elijah Refused to Be Discouraged

And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down, that the rain stop thee not. 1 Kings 18:44. {SD 206.1}

Important lessons are presented to us in the experience of Elijah. When upon Mt. Carmel he offered the prayer for rain, his faith was tested, but he persevered in making known his request unto God. Six times he prayed earnestly, and yet there was no sign that his **petition** was granted, but with a strong faith he urged his plea to the throne of grace. Had he given up in discouragement at the sixth time, his prayer would not have been answered. . . . We have a God whose ear is not closed to our petitions; and if we prove His word, He will honor our faith. He wants us to have all our interests **interwoven** with His interests, and then He can **safely** bless us; for we shall not then take glory to self when the blessing is ours, but shall render all the praise to God. God does not always answer our prayers the first time we call upon Him; for should He do this, we might take it for granted that we had a right to all the blessings and favors He bestowed upon us. **{SD 206.2}**

The servant watched while Elijah prayed. . . . As he searched his heart, he seemed to be less and less, both in his own **estimation** and in the sight of God. It seemed to him that he was nothing, and that God was everything; and when he reached the point of renouncing self, while he clung to the Saviour as his only strength and righteousness, the **answer** came. **{SD 206.3}**

However **courageous** and **successful** a man may be in the **performance** of a special work, unless he looks constantly to God when **circumstances** arise to test his faith he will lose his courage. Even after God has given him marked tokens of His power, after he has been strengthened to do God's work, he will fail unless he trusts **implicitly** in **Omnipotence**. **{SD 206.4}**

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

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


