Chapter 8-We are Justified by Christ's Blood

God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him. Romans 5:8, 9. {SD 227.1}

Christ has made **reconciliation** for sin, and has borne all its **ignominy**, reproach, and punishment; and yet while bearing sin, He has brought in everlasting righteousness, so that the believer is **spotless** before God. . . . {SD 227.2}

But there are many who claim to be children of God who are resting their hopes upon other **dependencies**, rather than on the blood of Christ alone. When urged to rest their faith wholly upon Christ as a complete Saviour, many reveal the fact that they have faith in something that they think they can do.

They say, "I have a great deal to do before I can be fit to come to Christ." Another says, "When I have done to the **uttermost** all that I can do, then the Lord Jesus will come to my help." They **imagine** that they have a great deal to do themselves to save their own souls, and that Jesus will come in and piece out that part which is lacking, and give the finishing stroke to their salvation. These poor souls will not be strong in God until they accept Christ as a complete Saviour.

They can add nothing to their salvation. {SD 227.3}

The Israelites were required to **sprinkle** the door-posts with the blood of a slain lamb, in order that when the angel of death passed through the land, they might escape destruction. But if instead of doing this simple act of faith and obedience, they had **barricaded** the door, and taken every **precaution** to keep the destroying angel out, their pains would have been in vain. . . . When the blood was seen upon the **door-post**, it was enough. The salvation of the house was **assured**. So it is in the work of salvation; it is the blood of Jesus Christ that cleanseth from all sin. {SD 227.4}

Through the **merits** of His blood, you may overcome every spiritual foe, and remedy every defect of character. {SD 227.5}



The wisdom of Christ's answer had convicted the scribe. He knew that the Jewish religion consisted in outward ceremonies rather than inward piety. He had some sense of the worthlessness of mere ceremonial offerings, and the faithless shedding of blood for expiation of sin. Love and obedience to God, and unselfish regard for man, appeared to him of more value than all these rites. The readiness of this man to acknowledge the correctness of Christ's reasoning, (Next Slide Please)



Continuing: and his decided and prompt response before the people, manifested a spirit entirely different from that of the priests and rulers.

The heart of Jesus went out in pity to the honest scribe who had dared to face the frowns of the priests and the threats of the rulers to speak the convictions of his heart.




The scribe was near to the kingdom of God, in that he recognized deeds of righteousness as more acceptable to God than burnt offerings and sacrifices. But he needed to recognize the divine character of Christ, and through faith in Him receive power to do the works of righteousness. The ritual service was of no value, unless connected with Christ by living faith. Even the moral law fails of its purpose, unless it is understood in its relation to the Saviour. (Next Slide Please)

**Continuing:
Christ had repeatedly
shown that His Father's
law contained something
deeper than mere
authoritative commands.
In the law is embodied
the same principle that is
revealed in the gospel.
The law points out man's
duty and shows him his guilt.
To Christ he must look
for pardon and for power
to do what the law enjoins.

The Pharisees had gathered close about Jesus as He answered the question of the scribe.

Now turning He put a question to them: “What think ye of Christ? whose son is He?”

This question was designed to test their belief concerning the Messiah,-- to show whether they regarded Him simply as a man or as the Son of God. {Next Slide Please }

“Is not this the Son of David?”



