IN THE BEGINNING - PART 2

Continuing: So, the next day God said, "Let there be **air**, to make the sky.

Continuing: All at once there was dry land, and it rose above the waters.


Continuing: Then the **earth** turned on, away from the **daylight** into the **darkness** of the night.



Christ's indignation was directed against the hypocrisy, the gross sins, by which men were destroying their own souls, deceiving the people and dishonoring God.

In the specious deceptive reasoning of the priests and rulers He discerned the working of satanic agencies. Keen and searching had been His denunciation of sin; but He spoke no words of retaliation. He had a holy wrath against the prince of darkness; but He manifested no irritated temper.



long-suffering love of the Deity.**



