Water Lessons

John 4:5-15

Most wells are a good place to get fresh water for drinking. A story is told about a well in the Bible in John 4:5-15 (read). Jesus came to this earth to **unselfishly** become the "Water of Life" to thirsty souls.

The opposite of a well with pure fresh water is a cistern. It was cut in stone and was used to catch water. The water would become stagnant (motionless) in it. Many times the cistern was used for a prison. It would be foolish to trade a flowing spring or a well of water for a leaky cistern of stagnant water. But God said, *"...my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water"* (Jeremiah 2:13).



Jesus, the "Water of Life," was born as a baby, grew as a child, developed as a youth, and became a man to show each child and adult how to live **unselfish** lives. He **unselfishly** laid aside and took our form which he will keep throughout all eternity.

In the Scriptures we find an expression "*weak as water*" (Ezekiel 7:17). Nothing is weaker than a helpless human baby. Jesus **unselfishly** lowered Himself, like water seeks the lowest level, and became not only a defenseless baby but also took our weak, sinful nature. Little human babies are more helpless than any of the

newborns from the animal kingdom. Christ **unselfishly** chose to become as "*weak as water*" to show us that God's strength is made perfect in weakness (II Corinthians 12:9). His birth teaches us that in our lowest and weakest state, we may be strong in the Lord and in the

Heaven Rejoices

"And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered.

"And she brought forth her first-born son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn" (Luke 2:6-7).

Men know it not, but the tidings fill heaven with rejoicing. With a deeper and more tender interest the holy beings from the world of light are drawn to the earth. The whole world is brighter for His presence. Above the hills of Bethlehem are gathered an innumerable throng of angels. They wait the signal to declare the glad news to the world. Had the leaders in Israel been true to their trust, they might have shared the joy of heralding the birth of Jesus. But now they are passed by.

"God declares, *'I will pour water upon him that is thirsty, and floods upon the dry ground.'* *'Unto the upright there ariseth light in the darkness'* (Isaiah 44:3; Psalm 112:4). To those who are seeking for light and who accept it with gladness, the bright rays from the throne of God will shine." (*The Desire of Ages* 47)

"Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

"Make me to hear joy and gladness; that the bones which thou hast broken may rejoice.

"Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities.

"Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:7-10).

"So shall he sprinkle many nations..." (Isaiah 52:15).

"Then will I sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols, will I cleanse you.

"A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh.


"And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.

But to pray in Christ's name means much. It means that we are to accept His character, manifest His spirit, and work His works. The Saviour's promise is given on condition.


“If ye love Me,”


