Chapter 3 - The Visit of the Wise Men

Matthew Chapter 2:1-2 (KJV)

Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

God wanted the people to know about the coming of Christ to the earth. The priests should have taught the people to look for the Saviour; but they themselves did not know of His coming.

So God sent angels to tell the shepherds that Christ was born, and where they might find Him. So, too, when Jesus was presented at the temple, there were those who received Him as the Saviour. God had preserved the lives of Simeon and Anna, and they had the joyful privilege of testifying that Jesus was the promised Messiah. {SJ 21.1- 3}

God meant for others, as well as the Jews, to know that Christ had come. In a country far to the east were wise men who had studied the prophecies concerning the Messiah, and who believed that His coming was near. {SJ 21.4}

The Jews called these men heathen; but they were not idolaters. They were honest men, who wanted to know the truth, and to do the will of God. {SJ 21.5}

Continuing:

God looks upon the heart, and He knew that these men could be trusted. They were in a better condition to receive light from Heaven than were the Jewish priests, who were so full of selfishness and pride. {SJ 21.6}

These wise men were philosophers. They had studied the handiwork of God in nature, and had learned to love Him there. They had studied the stars, and knew their movements. {SJ 23.1}

They loved to watch the heavenly bodies in their nightly march.

If a new star should be seen, they would welcome its appearance as a great event. {SJ 23.2}

On that night when the angels came to the shepherds of Bethlehem, the wise men had noticed a strange light in the sky. It was the glory which surrounded the angel host. {SJ 23.3}

When this light faded away, they had seen in the heavens what looked like a new star.

At once they thought of the prophecy which says,

“There shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel.” **Numbers 24:17.**

Was this star a sign that the Messiah had come?

They determined to follow it, and see where it would lead them. It led them into Judea.

But when they came near to Jerusalem, the star grew so dim that they could not follow it.





Nature Solid Water

How Ice Is Formed?

Remember, solid water is ice. It is just frozen water! When the temperature becomes very cold ice begins to form on lakes and rivers. Frost, snow, sleet, and hail are ice, and so are glaciers. We are told, "God encourages us to contemplate His works in the natural world. He desires that we shall turn our mind from the study of the artificial to the natural. We shall understand this better as we lift up our eyes to the hills of God, and contemplate the works which His own hands have created. They are God's work. His hand has molded the mountains and balances them in their position, that they shall not be moved except at His command. The wind, the sun, the rain, the snow, and the ice, are all His ministers to do His will." (3 Bible Commentary 1144-1145)

Just as God wants us "to contemplate His works in the natural world," so the wise men studied the stars and learned more about God. They were men of **integrity** who wanted to do God's will. "*The integrity of the upright shall guide them*" (Proverbs 11:3).

Ice forms when the temperature of pure water becomes cold. 32° F [0° C] is called the freezing point of water. Ice reflects the light that falls upon it. It can remind us of how the angels reflected light to guide the wise men.

Do you remember that most substances get smaller when they get cold? But what happens to water when it freezes into ice? It expands and increases in size. The molecules of water are close together moving about quickly here and there. As water freezes, the molecules move farther apart and move more slowly. They arrange themselves into a pattern. Freezing also make ice lighter so it floats on water. Warm "Christians" are like water molecules. cold-hearted "Christians" are like molecules in a piece of ice. Why? They move away from others; they are cold, self-centered, and not friendly. The priests and rulers were like ice molecules.


Ice will melt when the air around it becomes warmer (above 32° F [0° C]). God's Spirit, like a warm wind, can change people's hearts. "*A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you...*" (Ezekiel 36:26).

Ice can be pounded into a powder form, but it will freeze back into a solid mass again. But if it is warmed by the sun, of course, it quickly melts. The lesson in this is that you can argue with a person until you reduce his arguments to powder, but they will freeze solid in resistance again. On the other hand, if the person is warmed with love, they will melt and become your friend. The priests were like the pounded ice. They were resisting the facts brought to them that the Messiah had been born. But, in due time, Jesus Himself would shine His love upon them, and many of their cold hearts would eventually melt in surrender.



Integrity is complete uprightness and moral purity in my life.





After the hymn,






he would have been kept.


But Peter felt that
