



## Chapter 3 - The Visit of the Wise Men

Matthew Chapter 2:1-2 (KJV)

**Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.**

God wanted the people to know about the coming of Christ to the earth. The priests should have taught the people to look for the Saviour; but they themselves did not know of His coming.

So God sent angels to tell the shepherds that Christ was born, and where they might find Him.


So, too, when Jesus was presented at the temple, there were those who received Him as the Saviour. God had preserved the lives of Simeon and Anna, and they had the joyful privilege of testifying that Jesus was the promised Messiah. {SJ 21.1- 3}

God meant for others, as well as the Jews, to know that Christ had come.

In a country far to the east were wise men who had studied the prophecies concerning the Messiah, and who believed that His coming was near. {SJ 21.4}

The Jews called these men heathen; but they were not idolaters. They were honest men, who wanted to know the truth, and to do the will of God. {SJ 21.5}

## Continuing:

God looks upon the heart, and He knew that these men could be trusted.

They were in a better condition to receive light from Heaven than were the Jewish priests, who were so full of selfishness and pride. {SJ 21.6}

These wise men were philosophers. They had studied the handiwork of God in nature, and had learned to love Him there. They had studied the stars, and knew their movements. {SJ 23.1}

They loved to watch the heavenly bodies in their nightly march.

If a new star should be seen, they would welcome its appearance as a great event. {SJ 23.2}

On that night when the angels came to the shepherds of Bethlehem, the wise men had noticed a strange light in the sky. It was the glory which surrounded the angel host. {SJ 23.3}

When this light faded away, they had seen in the heavens what looked like a new star.

At once they thought of the prophecy which says,

“There shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel.” **Numbers 24:17.**

Was this star a sign that the Messiah had come?

They determined to follow it, and see where it would lead them. It led them into Judea.


But when they came near to Jerusalem, the star grew so dim that they could not follow it.

### Chapter 6 – “We Have Seen His Star”

“Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, **behold, there came wise men from the East to Jerusalem**, saying, Where is He that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen **His star in the East**, and are come to worship Him.” {DA 59.1}

The wise men from the East were philosophers. They belonged to a large and influential class that included men of noble birth, and comprised much of the wealth and learning of their nation. Among these were many who imposed on the credulity of the people. Others were upright men who studied the indications of Providence in nature, and who were honored for their integrity and wisdom. Of this character were the wise men who came to Jesus. {DA 59.2}

The light of God is ever shining amid the darkness of heathenism. As these magi studied the starry heavens, and sought to fathom the mystery hidden in their bright paths, they beheld the glory of the Creator. Seeking clearer knowledge, they turned to the Hebrew Scriptures.

In their own land were treasured prophetic writings that predicted the coming of a divine teacher.

Balaam belonged to the magicians, though at one time a prophet of God; by the Holy Spirit he had foretold the prosperity of Israel and the appearing of the Messiah; and his prophecies had been handed down by tradition from century to century.

## Research A Shining Star

*"Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem.*

*"Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him"* (Matthew 2:1-2).

"The wise men had seen a mysterious light in the heavens upon that night when the glory of God flooded the hills of Bethlehem. As the light faded, a luminous star appeared, and lingered in the sky. It was not a fixed star nor a planet, and the phenomenon excited the keenest interest. That star was a distant company of shining angels, but of this the wise men were ignorant. Yet they were impressed that the star was of special import to them. They consulted priests and philosophers, and searched the scrolls of the ancient records. The prophecy of Balaam had declared, *'There shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Scepter shall rise out of Israel'* (Numbers 24:17). Could this strange star have been sent as a harbinger\* of the Promised One? The magi had welcomed the light of heaven-sent truth; now it was shed upon them in brighter rays. Through dreams they were instructed to go in search of the newborn Prince.

"As by faith Abraham went forth at the call of God, *'not knowing whither he went'* (Hebrews 11:8); as by faith Israel followed the pillar of cloud to the Promised Land, so did these Gentiles go forth to find the promised Saviour. The Eastern country abounded in precious things, and the magi did not set out empty-handed. It was the custom to offer presents as an act of homage to princes or other personages of rank, and the richest gifts the land afforded were borne as an offering to Him in whom all the families of the earth were to be blessed. It was necessary to journey by night in order to keep the star in view; but the travelers beguiled the hours by repeating traditional sayings and prophetic utterances concerning the One they sought. At every pause for rest they searched the prophecies; and the conviction deepened that they were divinely guided. While they had the star before them as an outward sign, they had also the inward evidence of the Holy Spirit, which was impressing their hearts, and inspiring them with hope. The journey, though long, was a happy one to them." (*The Desire of Ages* 60)



The wise men were men of integrity, honest, and seeking truth. God guided them in the darkness of the night by a shining star. So He will guide us when we go through dark times in our lives. Jesus is our "Heavenly Guiding Star." (*Testimonies to Ministers* 212) Besides the star of angels, what was another way that God had used to guide the wise men in their search for the Messiah? The answer is "they searched the prophecies" to find out where Jesus was. (*The Desire of Ages* 60) We can be "wise men" too if we also search the prophecies. They tell us where Jesus is today. "*Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory*" (Psalm 73:24).

## Remarkable Parent Food

"The Lord moved upon the wise men to go in search of Jesus, and He directed their course by a star. This star, leaving them when near Jerusalem, led them to make inquiries in Judah; for they thought it was not possible for the chief priests and scribes to be ignorant of this great event. The coming of the wise men made the whole nation acquainted with the object of their journey, and directed their attention to the important events which were transpiring." (*5 Bible Commentary* 1077)




Praise ye the Lord.”







Continuing:

Hidden in his heart were elements of evil that circumstances would fan into life.





Unless he was made conscious of his danger, these would prove his eternal ruin.

When on the Sea of Galilee he was about to sink, he cried, “Lord, save me.”



