





Chapter 5 - Child Life of Jesus

Jesus in His childhood lived in a little mountain village.

He was the Son of God, and He might have had any place on earth for His home. {SJ 29.1}

He would have been an honor to any place. But He did not go to the homes of rich men or the palaces of kings. He chose to dwell among the poor in Nazareth. {SJ 29.2}

Jesus wants the poor to know that He understands their trials.

He has borne all that they have to bear. He can sympathize with them and help them. {SJ 29.3}

Of Jesus in His early years the Bible says,

“The child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, filled with wisdom: and the grace of God was upon Him.”

“And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.” **Luke 2:40, 52.**

His mind was bright and active. He was of quick understanding, and showed a thoughtfulness and wisdom beyond His years. Yet His ways were simple and childlike, and He grew in mind and body as other children grow. {SJ 29.5}

But Jesus was not in all things like other children. He always showed a sweet, unselfish spirit.

His willing hands were always ready to serve others. He was patient and truthful.

Continuing:

Firm as a rock in standing for the right, He never failed to be gentle and courteous toward all.

In His home, and wherever He might be, He was like a cheerful sunbeam. {SJ 30.1}

He was thoughtful and kind toward the aged and the poor, and He showed kindness even to the dumb animals. He would care tenderly for a little wounded bird, and every living thing was happier when He was near. {SJ 30.2}

In the days of Christ the Jews gave much care to the education of their children.

Their schools were connected with the synagogues, or places of worship, and the teachers were called rabbis, men who were supposed to be very learned. {SJ 30.3}

Jesus did not go to these schools, for they taught many things that were not true.

Instead of God's Word, the sayings of men were studied, and often these were contrary to that which God had taught through His prophets. {SJ 30.4}

God Himself by His Holy Spirit instructed Mary how to bring up His Son. Mary taught Jesus from the Holy Scriptures, and He learned to read and study them for Himself. {SJ 30.5}

Jesus also loved to study the wonderful things which God had made, in the earth and in the sky.

In this book of nature He saw the trees and plants and animals, and the sun and the stars.

Chapter 7 – As a Child

The childhood and youth of Jesus were spent in a little mountain village. There was no place on earth that would not have been honored by His presence. The palaces of kings would have been privileged in receiving Him as a guest.

But He passed by the homes of wealth, the courts of royalty, and the renowned seats of learning, to make His home in obscure and despised Nazareth. {DA 68.1}

Wonderful in its significance is the brief record of His early life: "The child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, filled with wisdom: and the grace of God was upon Him." In the sunlight of His Father's countenance, Jesus "increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." **Luke 2:52**. His mind was active and penetrating, with a thoughtfulness and wisdom beyond His years. Yet His character was beautiful in its symmetry.

The powers of mind and body developed gradually, in keeping with the laws of childhood. {DA 68.2} As a child, Jesus manifested a peculiar loveliness of disposition. His willing hands were ever ready to serve others. He manifested a patience that nothing could disturb, and a truthfulness that would never sacrifice integrity.

In principle firm as a rock, His life revealed the grace of unselfish courtesy. {DA 68.3} With deep earnestness the mother of Jesus watched the unfolding of His powers, and beheld the impress of perfection upon His character. With delight she sought to encourage that bright, receptive mind.

Through the Holy Spirit she received wisdom to co-operate with the heavenly agencies in the development of this child, who could claim only God as His Father. {DA 69.1}

From the earliest times the faithful in Israel had given much care to the education of the youth. The Lord had directed that even from babyhood the children should be taught of His goodness and His greatness, especially as revealed in His law, and shown in the history of Israel.

Song and prayer and lessons from the Scriptures were to be adapted to the opening mind.

Fathers and mothers were to instruct their children that the law of God is an expression of His character, and that as they received the principles of the law into the heart, the image of God was traced on mind and soul.

Much of the teaching was oral; but the youth also learned to read the Hebrew writings; and the parchment rolls of the Old Testament Scriptures were open to their study. {DA 69.2}

In the days of Christ the town or city that did not provide for the religious instruction of the young was regarded as under the curse of God. Yet the teaching had become formal. Tradition had in a great degree supplanted the Scriptures. True education would lead the youth to "seek the Lord, if haply they might feel after Him, and find Him." Acts 17:27.

But the Jewish teachers gave their attention to matters of ceremony. The mind was crowded with material that was worthless to the learner, and that would not be recognized in the higher school of the courts above.

The experience which is obtained through a personal acceptance of God's word had no place in the educational system. Absorbed in the round of externals, the students found no quiet hours to spend with God.

They did not hear His voice speaking to the heart. In their search after knowledge, they turned away from the Source of wisdom. The great essentials of the service of God were neglected. The principles of the law were obscured. That which was regarded as superior education was the greatest hindrance to real development. Under the training of the rabbis the powers of the youth were repressed. Their minds became cramped and narrow. {DA 69.3}

The child Jesus did not receive instruction in the synagogue schools. His mother was His first human teacher.

From her lips and from the scrolls of the prophets, He learned of heavenly things.

The very words which He Himself had spoken to Moses for Israel He was now taught at His mother's knee.

As He advanced from childhood to youth, He did not seek the schools of the rabbis. He needed not the education to be obtained from such sources; for God was His instructor. {DA 70.1}




“Joseph, who was still in Egypt, was now bidden by an angel of God to return to the land of Israel. Regarding Jesus as the heir of David's throne, Joseph desired to make his home in Bethlehem; but learning that Archelaus reigned in Judea in his father's stead, he feared that the father's designs against Christ might be carried out by the son. Of all the sons of Herod, Archelaus most resembled him in character. Already his succession to the government had been marked by a tumult in Jerusalem, and the slaughter of thousands of Jews by the Roman guards.

“Again Joseph was directed to a place of safety. He returned to Nazareth, his former home, and here for nearly thirty years Jesus dwelt, *that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, he shall be called a Nazarene.*’ Galilee was under the control of a son of Herod, but it had a much larger admixture of foreign inhabitants than Judea. Thus there was less interest in matters relating especially to the Jews, and the claims of Jesus would be less likely to excite the jealousy of those in power.

“Such was the Saviour's reception when He came to the earth. There seemed to be no place of rest or safety for the infant Redeemer. God could not trust His beloved son with men, even while carrying

forward His work for their salvation. He commissioned angels to attend Jesus and protect Him till He should accomplish His mission on earth, and die by the hands of those whom He came to save.”
(The Desire of Ages 66-67)



"God is the source of all wisdom. He is infinitely wise and just and good. Apart from Christ, the wisest men that ever lived cannot comprehend Him. They may profess to be wise; they may glory in their attainments; but mere intellectual knowledge, aside from the great truths that center in Christ, is as nothingness. *Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom...but let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the Lord which exercise loving-kindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth'* (Jeremiah 9:23-24).

"If men could see for a moment beyond the range of finite vision, if they could catch a glimpse of the Eternal, every mouth would be stopped in its boasting. Sharing a Thought taking from SC - Steps to Christ

The change of heart by which we become children of God is in the Bible spoken of as birth. Again, it is compared to the germination of the good seed sown by the husbandman. 


