




4:14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.


John Chapter 2:9 (KJV)

How glad she was to know this! In her joy she hurried away to the town near by, and called the people to come and see Jesus. **{SJ 55.6}**


So they came to the well, and asked Him to stay with them.

Continuing:



Nature Dams

There are two kinds of dams. One is made of concrete and stone. They are called masonry dams. Other dams are made of earth and rocks, and they are called embankment dams. Two things Jesus needed, a container and water for the miracle He was going to perform. To perform a miracle in your life He needs you (the vessel) and Himself (the "*Water of Life*") to make a new creation (pure grape juice).

In order to construct a dam the builders must gather and study much information. Some of the things to consider are the pattern of the area, the stream flow, the area that will be covered by the water, rock formation, and many other things.

We, too, can study to know how to "*...be in Christ,*" Then we can be "*...a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new*" (II Corinthians 5:17).

When building a dam a way to bypass the flow of the stream from the riverbed must be found. Why? So the foundation can be built. Many times a bypass path is made for the river to flow around the dam site. Once the dam is completed then the bypass path is made for the river to flow around the dam site. Once the dam is completed then the bypass path is plugged. To make a new creation out of us God needs to lead us on another path to bring us back where He wants us.


Just as the course of the water must be channeled in the right direction, so the Christian must form right habits that all his energy might be used in God's service.

Ways to care for the overflow must be made for the safety of the dam. When the reservoir is full, the excess water is allowed to flow through a spillway back to the main river. Dams can be dangerous. How? A dam can collapse sometimes because of poor construction or an earthquake. It could flood areas below it. Our spiritual safety is important and to make sure it never collapses we must **respectfully** give ourselves to Jesus every moment of every day.

Nature Waterfalls

What is a waterfall? It is the sudden descent of a stream or river from a higher to a lower place. As a river wears away its bed it may uncover layers of rock that are softer than others. As the soft rock wears faster than the hard, a waterfall may form. Many waterfalls were made during the time of the Flood. Some people today drink wine that is not pure, but fermented. It is like descending from a high spiritual place to a lower place. They waste their life and money, and do not care for their family properly. (Reread *The Desire of Ages* 149, paragraph four.)

Falls are usually found in more mountainous areas. The streams, starting high up in the mountain and flowing downward, may find paths over high ledges. They can be a very beautiful sight. Sometimes the water spray makes a rainbow. The clear water drop changing into lovely colors can remind us of how Jesus turned the clear water into colorful grape juice.

Waterfalls can also remind us of the beautiful act of Jesus descending from heaven to come down to this earth and live. That was as much a miracle as changing water into wine. It showed the many different “colors” of God’s love.



Caiaphas, perceiving the influence that was obtaining, hastened the trial.




The enemies of Jesus were in great perplexity.

The members of the council were divided between the Pharisees and the Sadducees.


There was bitter animosity and controversy between them; certain disputed points they dared not approach for fear of a quarrel.



Caiaphas knew this,

There were plenty of witnesses
to prove that Christ had
denounced the priests
and scribes, that He had called
them hypocrites and murderers;
but this testimony it was not
expedient to bring forward.

Continuing:
The Sadducees in their sharp contentions with the Pharisees had used to them similar language. And such testimony would have no weight with the Romans, who were themselves disgusted with the pretensions of the Pharisees. There was abundant evidence that Jesus had disregarded the traditions of the Jews, and had spoken irreverently of many of their ordinances; {Next Slide Please}

For the Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, neither angel, nor spirit: but the Pharisees confess both. Acts 23:8



Continuing: but in regard to tradition the Pharisees and Sadducees were at swords' points; and this evidence also would have no weight with the Romans.

Christ's enemies dared not accuse Him of Sabbathbreaking, lest an examination should reveal the character of His work. If His miracles of healing were brought to light, the very object of the priests would be defeated.

False witnesses had been bribed to accuse Jesus of inciting rebellion and seeking to establish a separate government. But their testimony proved to be vague and contradictory. Under examination they falsified their own statements.

In the figurative language of prophecy, He had thus foretold His own death and resurrection.



“He spake of the temple of His body.” John 2:19, 21.

Of all that Christ had said, the priests could find nothing to use against Him save this.

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
**Continuing:
By misstating these words they hoped to gain an advantage. The Romans had engaged in rebuilding and embellishing the temple, and they took great pride in it; any contempt shown to it would be sure to excite their indignation. Here Romans and Jews, Pharisees and Sadducees, could meet; for all held the temple in great veneration.


Continuing:

On this point two witnesses were found whose testimony was not so contradictory as that of the others had been. One of them, who had been bribed to accuse Jesus, declared, “This fellow said, I am able to destroy the temple of God, and to build it in three days.”

Thus Christ's words were misstated. If they had been reported exactly as He spoke them, they would not have secured His condemnation even by the Sanhedrin.

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
