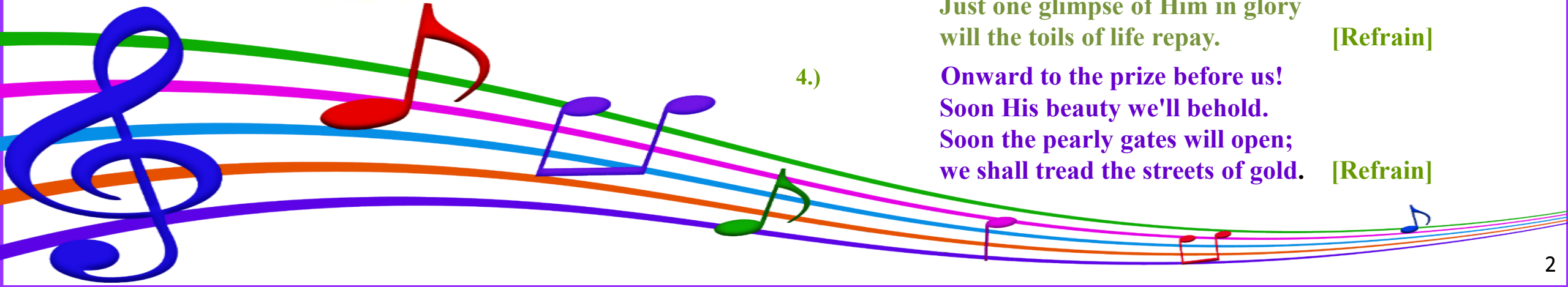

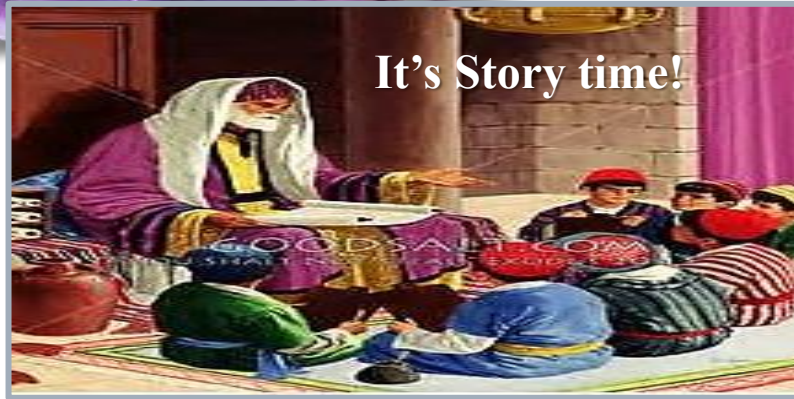

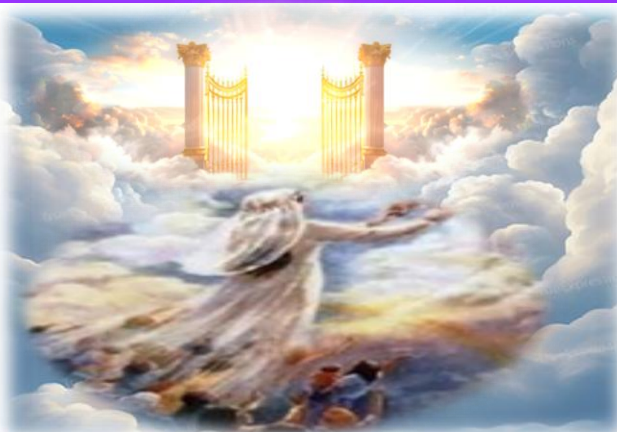

Chapter 32 – The Home of the Saved

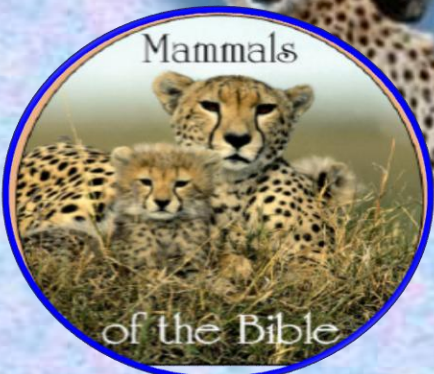

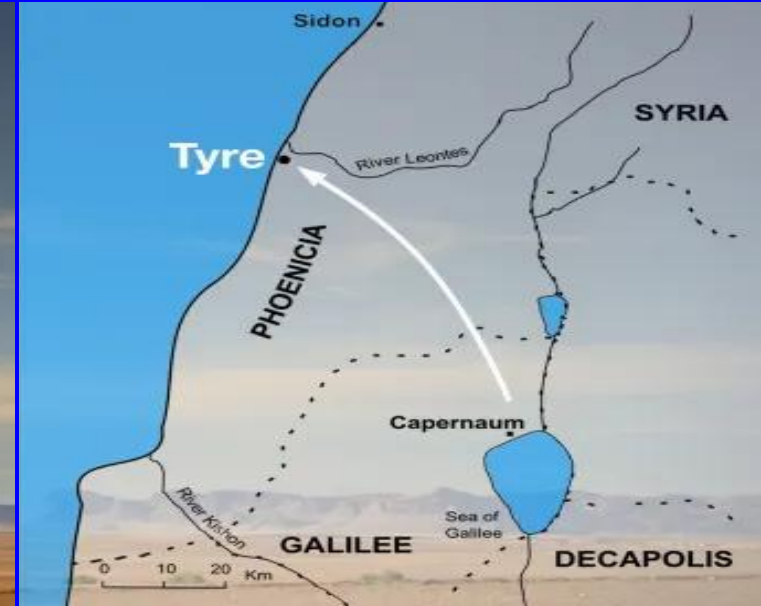
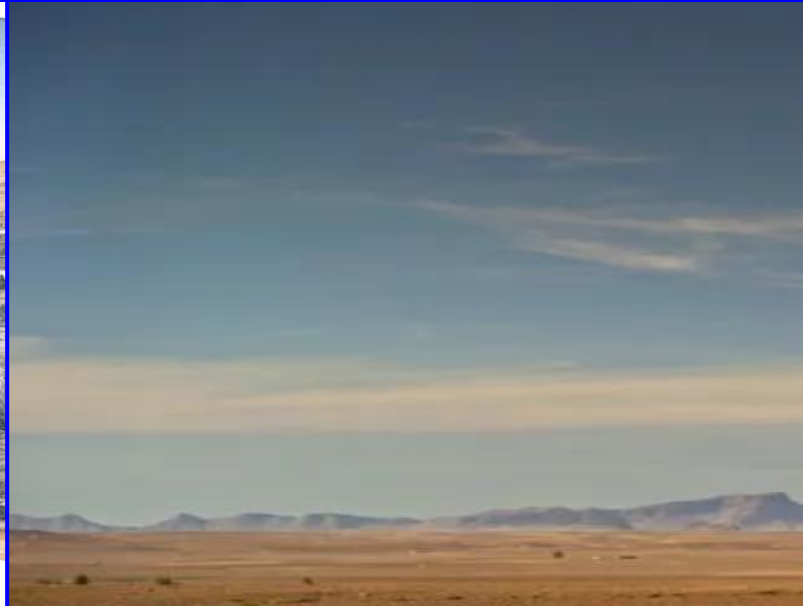

Mammals of Prey – Bears

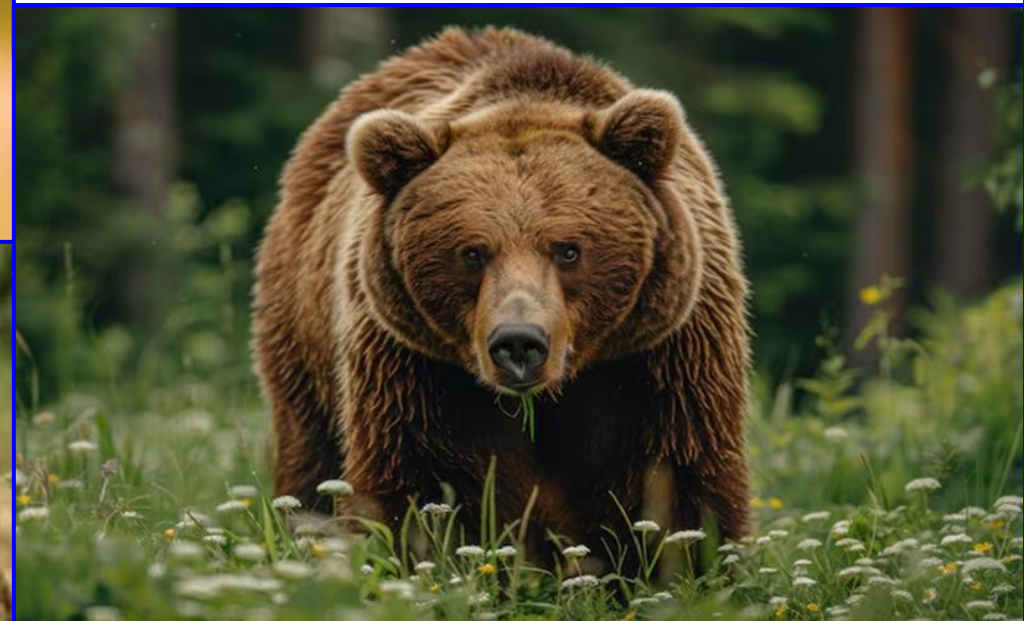
A Mammal has these characteristics:

1. Warm-blooded,
2. Has a backbone,
3. Two pairs of limbs,
4. More or less complete covering of hair,
5. Feeds its babies with milk,
6. Most give their young protection and training, and
7. Mammals have a larger, more well-developed brain than other animals.



There are several mammals of prey (which catch other animals for food) mentioned in the Bible. They are the wolf, fox, jackal, hyena, and the bear. This week we will learn information about the bear.

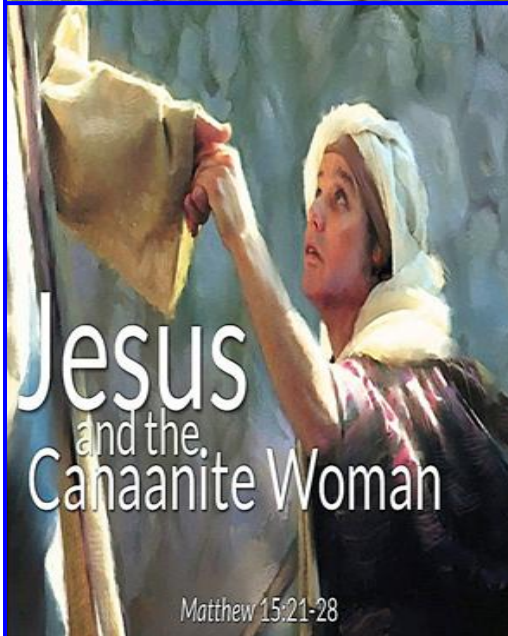
The bear is a large, powerful animal with thick, shaggy fur. It is a mammal. Bears not only eat other animals for food but also eat fruit, nuts, and leaves.



Male bears are called boars, and females are called sows. Young bears are called cubs. Their round heads and fur make them seem lovable and cuddly but bears can be very dangerous. They have powerful paws with five toes and long claws. Remember how David saved his sheep “*out of the paw of the bear?*” (I Samuel 17:37). Jesus delivered the woman’s daughter out of the “paw” of the devil as we shall see in our Bible story. The claws on the front feet of a bear are longer than the claws on the back feet. These are dangerous weapons, but are usually used for digging up food or catching fish. God never planned for bears to hurt other creatures with their paws. He also never planned for Satan to prey on human beings like the Syro-phoenician woman’s daughter.



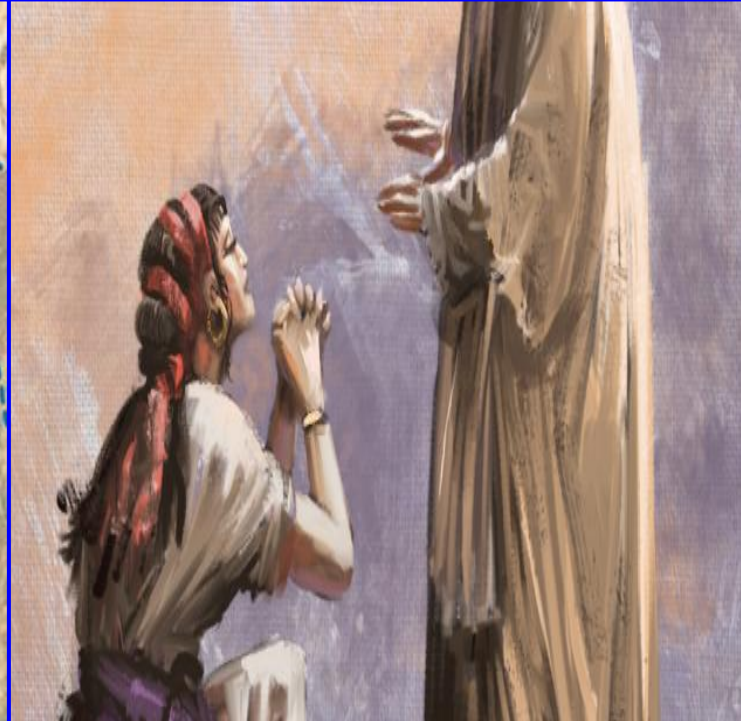
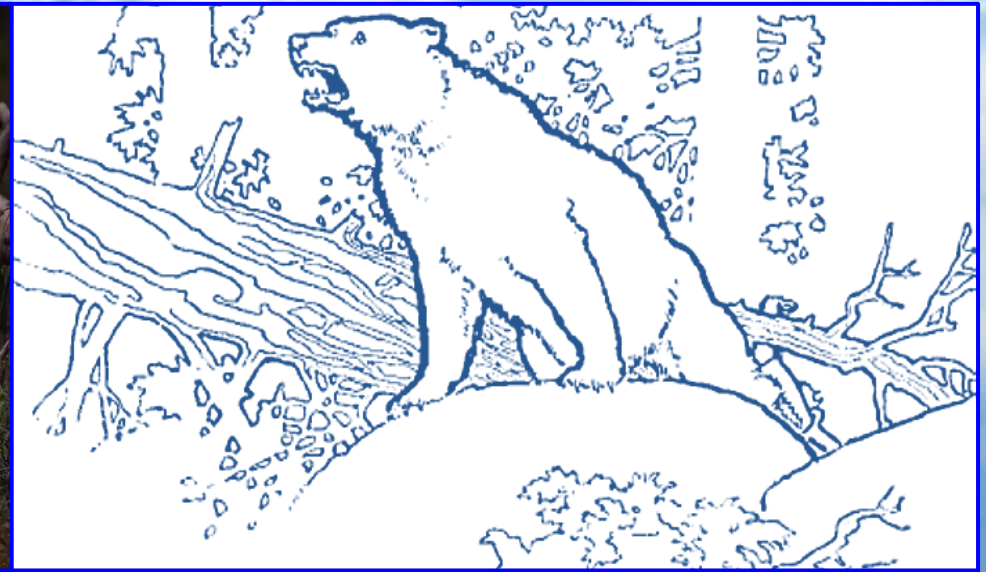
A Large Black Bear

When animals walk on flat feet it is called plantigrade (PLANT-uh-grade). Bears walk with their feet flat on the ground. Bears will walk and run on all fours, but they can also take a few steps while standing on their hind legs. Jesus’ legs and feet walked where the Holy Spirit led Him. One day It led Him to the coast of Tyre and Sidon.



Where do you find bears? In forests, meadows, river valleys, and even treeless plains. Where did Jesus find the woman of Canaan? On the coast of Tyre and Sidon. She had a daughter who was not healthy, for she was “*vexed with a devil.*”

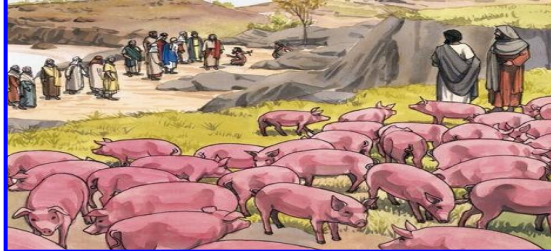
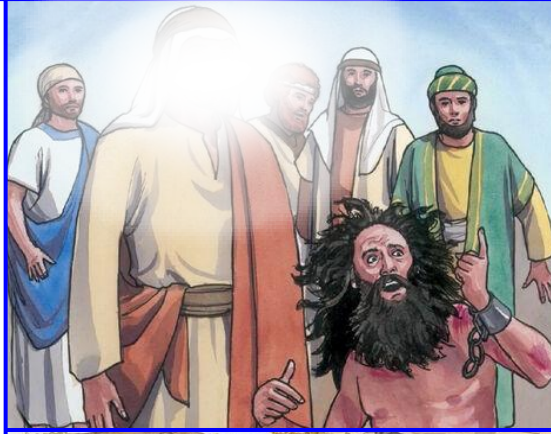

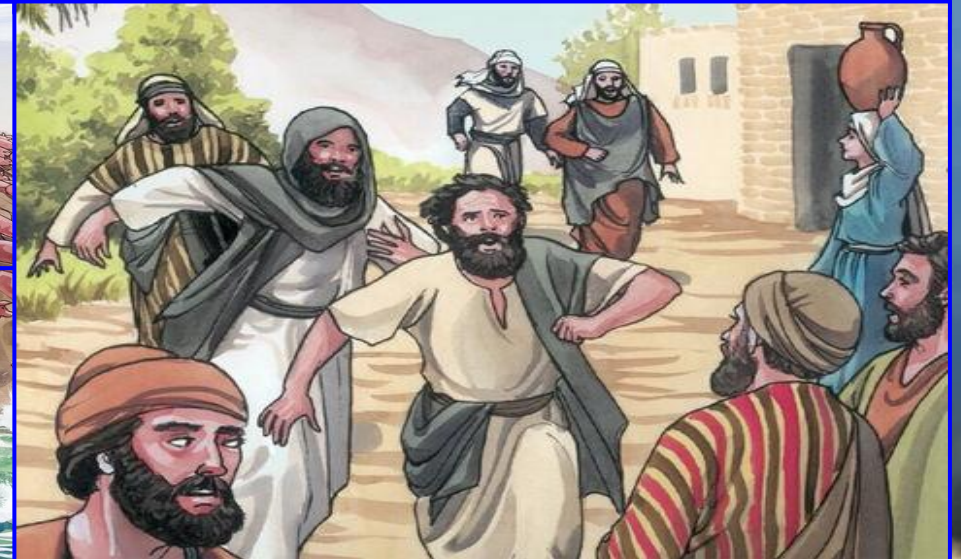


Remarkable Parent Food

“At the command of Jesus the evil spirits departed from their victims, leaving them calmly sitting at the Saviour’s feet, subdued, intelligent, and gentle. But the demons were permitted to sweep a herd of swine into the sea; and to the dwellers of Gadara the loss of these outweighed the blessings which Christ had bestowed, and the divine Healer was entreated to depart. This was the result which Satan designed to secure. By casting the blame of their loss upon Jesus, he aroused the selfish



fears of the people and prevented them from listening to His words. Satan is constantly accusing Christians as the cause of loss, misfortune, and suffering, instead of allowing the reproach to fall where it belongs—upon himself and his agents.



“Other instances of a similar nature are recorded in the Scriptures. The daughter of the Syro-phoenician woman was grievously vexed with a devil, whom Jesus cast out by His word (Mark 7:26-30). ‘*One possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb*’ (Matthew 12:22); a youth who had a dumb spirit, that oftentimes ‘*cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him*’ (Mark 9:17-27); the maniac who, tormented by ‘*a spirit of an unclean devil*’ (Luke 4:33-36), disturbed the Sabbath quiet of the synagogue at Capernaum—all were healed by the compassionate Saviour. In nearly ev-

ery instance, Christ addressed the demon as an intelligent entity, commanding him to come out of his victim and to torment him no more. The worshipers at Capernaum, beholding His mighty power, ‘*were all amazed, and spake among themselves, saying, What a word is this! for with authority and power He commandeth the unclean spirits, and they come out*’ (Luke 4:36).” (*The Great Controversy* 514-516)

Our First Word is Health

Laws of Nature and Life

Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. 3 John 2. {TDG-This Day with God 123.1}

HEALTH, n. helth. [from heal.]

That state of an animal or living body, in which the parts are sound, well organized and disposed, and in which they all perform freely their natural functions. In this state the animal feels no pain. This word is applied also to plants.

1. Sound state of the mind; natural vigor of faculties.
2. Sound state of the mind, in a moral sense; purity; goodness.

There is no health in us.

3. Salvation or divine favor, or grace which cheers God's people. Psalm 43:5.
4. Wish of health and happiness; used in drinking.
Come, love and health to all; an elliptical phrase, for, I wish health to you.

It is our duty to preserve and honor our bodies, in order that we shall not, by neglect, by selfish indulgence, by perverted appetite and passions, make ourselves bodies of corruption and impurity, loathsome in the sight of God, dying while life remains.

Our Second Word is Healthfulness

HEALTHFULNESS, n.

A state of being well; a state in which the parts of a living body are sound, and regularly perform their functions.

Wholesomeness; salubrity; state or qualities that promote health; as the healthfulness of the air, or of climate, or of diet, or of exercises.

(salubrity - the quality of being salubrious and invigorating)

WHOLESOMENESS, n. the quality of being morally good

the quality of being wholesome
(= healthy or good for you):

1. The quality of contributing to health; salubrith; as the wholesomeness of air or diet.
2. Salutariness; conduciveness to the health of the mind or of the body politic; as the wholesomeness of doctrines or laws.

Our Third Word is Conflict

CONFLICT, n. [L., to strike, to flog, to lick.]

1. A striking or dashing against each other, as of two moving bodies in opposition; violent collision of substances; as a conflict of elements, or waves; a conflict of particles in ebullition.
2. A fighting; combat, as between men, and applicable to individuals or to armies; as, the conflict was long and desperate.
3. Contention; strife; contest.
In our last conflict, four of his five wits went halting off.
4. Struggling with difficulties; a striving to oppose, or overcome.
The good man has a perpetual conflict with his evil propensities.
5. A struggling of the mind; distress; anxiety. **Colossians 2:1**.
6. The last struggle of life; agony; as the conflict with death.
7. Opposing operations; countervailing action; collision; opposition.
In exercising the right of freemen, the man of religion experiences no conflict between his duty and his inclination.

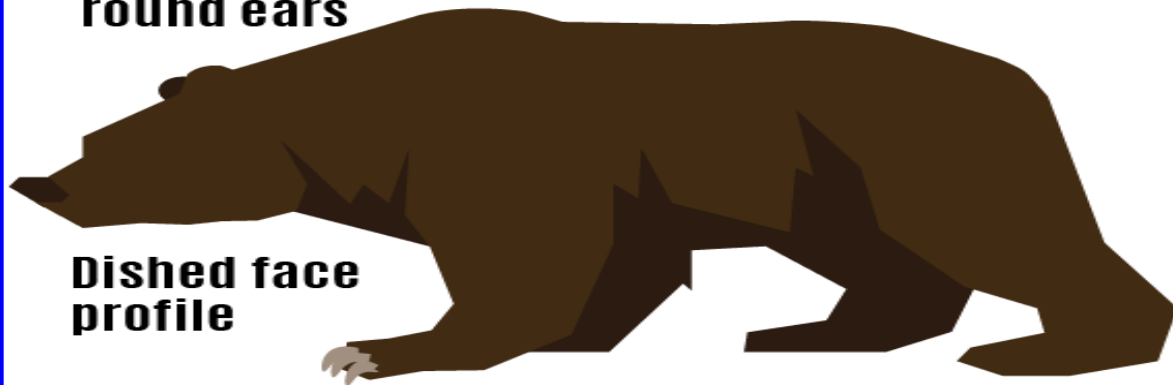
Grizzly Bear

Smaller, round ears

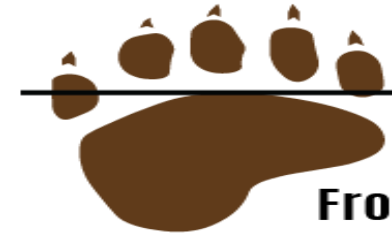
Shoulder hump

Long, 2-4" claws

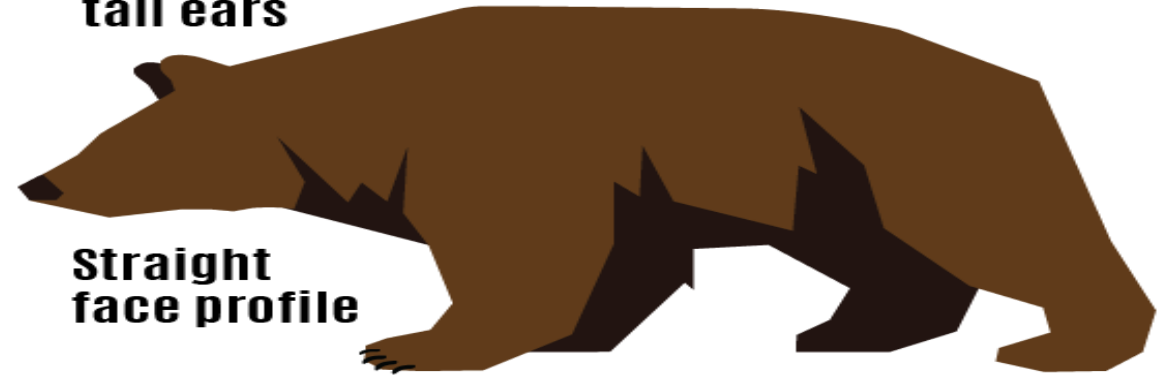
Black Bear

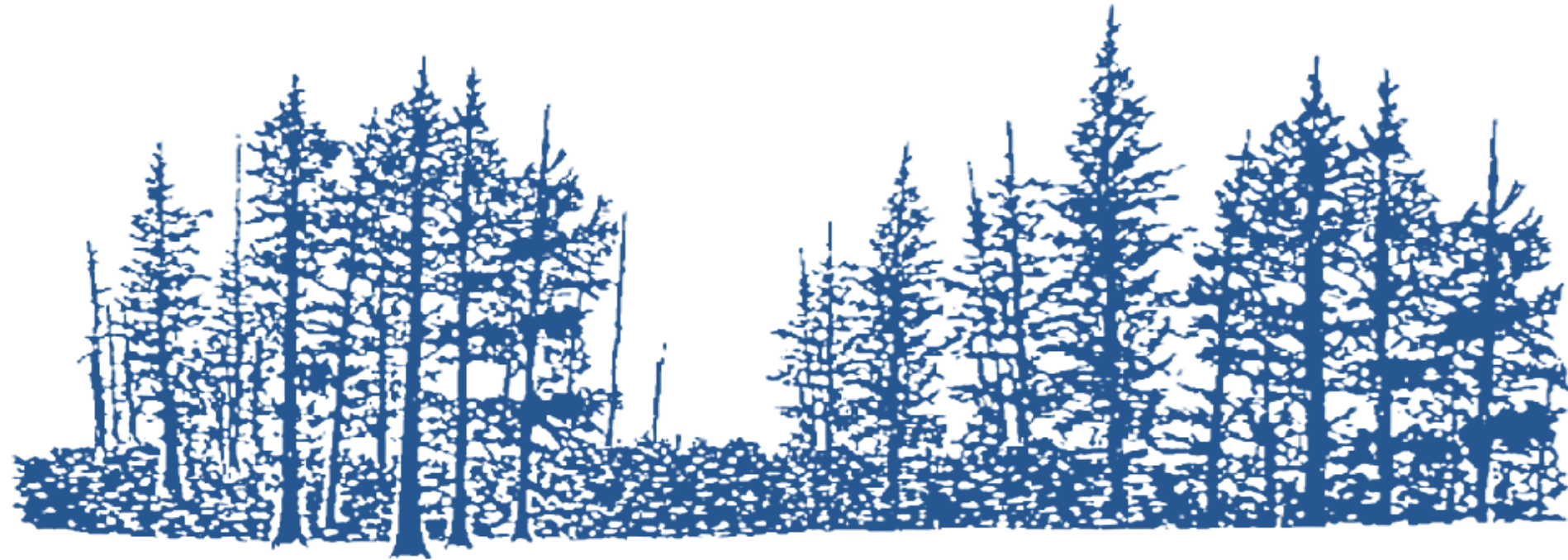

Habitat



Brown bears inhabit various habitats, including forests, tundra, meadows, and mountainous regions. Their range is quite extensive, covering the northern hemisphere. Here are several specific places where brown bears are found:



Forests

They can be encountered in taiga, coniferous, and deciduous forests.



Tundra

In some regions, brown bears inhabit the tundra, especially in the north.



Mountains

In mountainous areas like the Alaskan Range or the Rocky Mountains, brown bears can also be found.



Winter hibernation

october to april

In winter hibernation, they do not eat and do not go to the toilet.

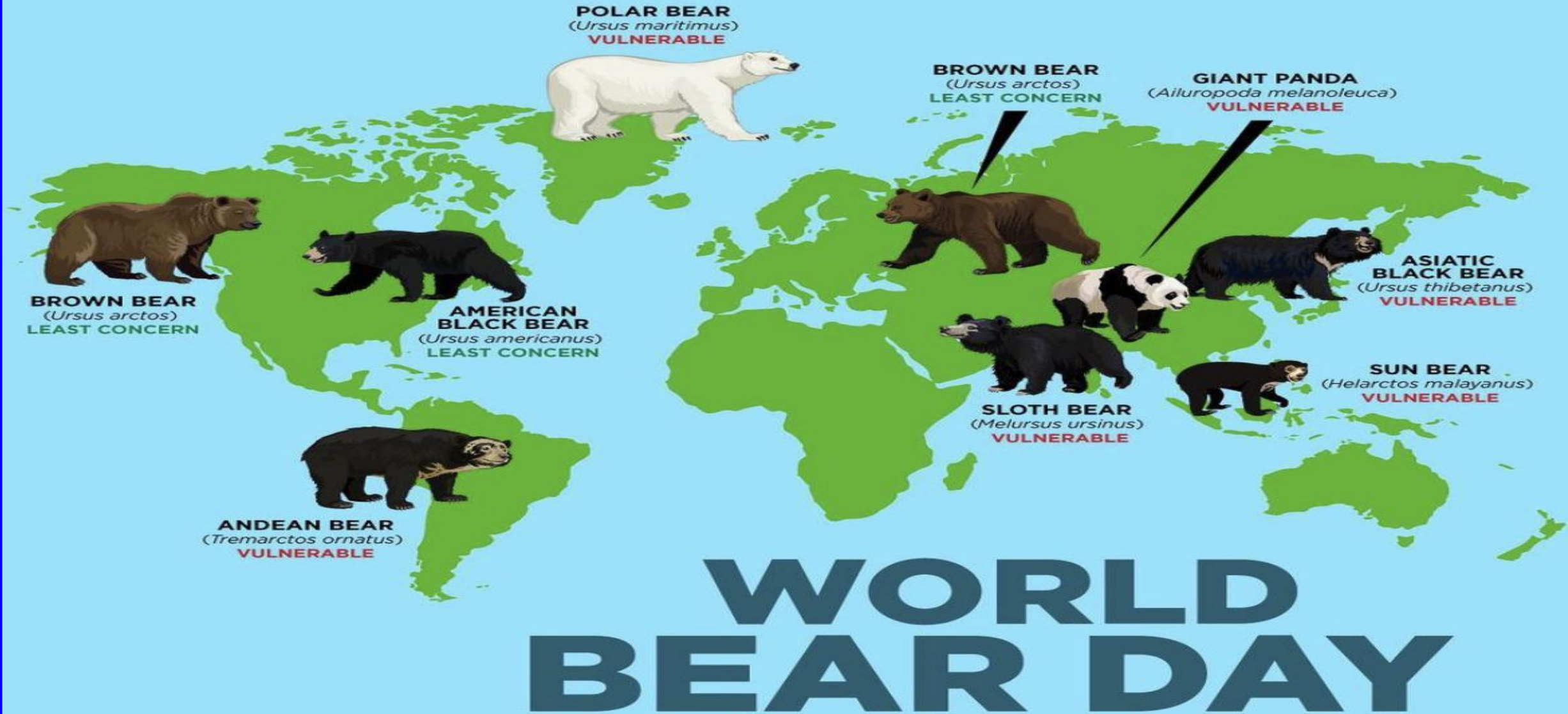
