Nature

A Bear's Body

Bears have long, thick fur, loose skin, and large, furry heads. Their eyes are small and they do not see well. On their heads are small, rounded ears standing straight up, and they have a good sense of hearing and are able to pick up sounds that human beings cannot hear. They also have an excellent sense of smell. The bear's good senses can remind us of the way the Syro-phoenician woman sensed that Jesus could help her even when the disciples did not pick up on it.



Bear's legs are short and strong and they have large feet. On each foot there are five toes with sharp claws at the ends. These claws can always be seen as they have no covering like a cat's. They get worn down during the year but grow all the way back out when bears hibernate.



Remember, we learned in part 1 how a bear walks. They walk flat-footed while most other animals walk and run on their toes. When walking, bears turn their front feet inward (“pigeon-toed”). They can pick up things with their paws and often put food into their mouths with them. The back, or hind foot of a bear may be 12 to



16 inches (30-41 centimeters) long. Because of the large feet, short legs, and their walking on flat feet, they seem slow and clumsy, but bears can move very fast. A polar bear can run as fast as 35 miles (56 kilometers) an hour.



Bears can also sit upright with their feet stretched out in front of them. They look very charming in that position. It can remind us how the Canaanite woman's humble posture (bowing at His feet) must have appealed to Jesus.



Bears are the only large predators that regularly eat both meat and plants. Their cheek teeth (molars) are broad and flat on top for mashing and grinding plant food. The front teeth (incisors) are pointed for catching and killing prey. God never created bears to eat other animals, that is a change that Satan or sin has brought about. God planned for all animals to be **healthy** and never to harm one another. The animals of the New Earth are described in Isaiah 11:6-9:



*"The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb,
and the leopard shall lie down with the
kid; and the calf and the young lion and
the fatling together; and a little child shall
lead them.*

*"And the cow and the bear shall feed; their
young ones shall lie down together: and
the lion shall eat straw like the ox.*



*"And the sucking child shall play on the
hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall
put his hand on the cockatrice's den.*

*"They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my
holy mountain: for the earth shall be full
of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters
cover the sea."*



The way the bears attack and tear apart their prey can also remind us of the critical attitude the Jews had toward their heathen neighbors. Instead of helping them, they turned them away from God. Remember how the disciples asked Jesus to send the Syro-phoenician woman away?



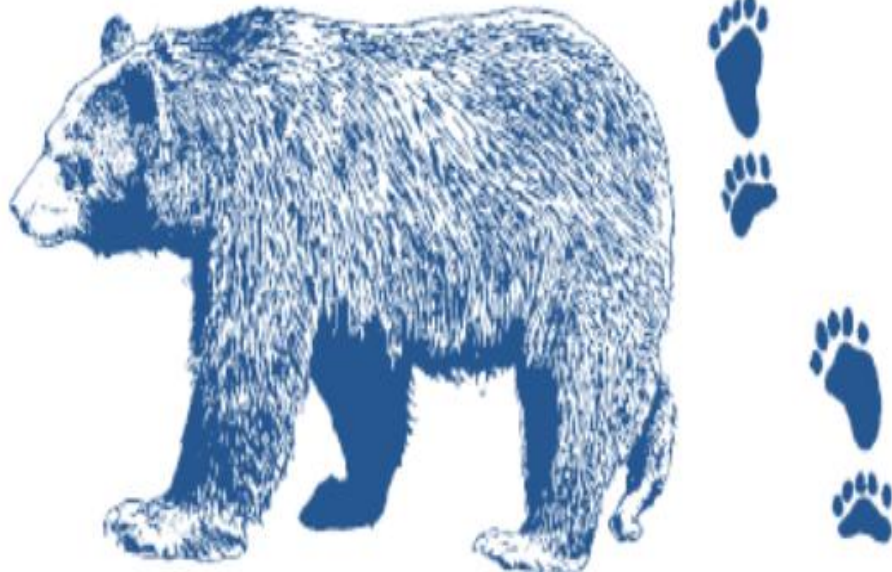
Remind

3. Think of ways you can help others who are in spiritual darkness instead of pulling them apart by criticism.

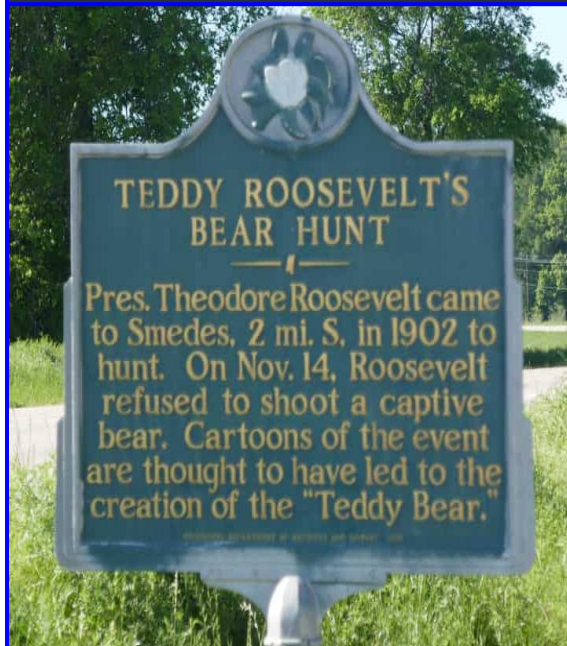


4. When you trim your nails remember how wear and tear trims the bears' nails.

Reinforce

1. Look for bears! Use your guide book to identify them.

2. See a bear in the wild, or visit one in captivity, if possible. Notice its feet, legs, head, ears, eyes, nose, and so forth.

3. Sew or buy a teddy bear for some child in a children's hospital. Do you know where "teddy bears" originated? In 1902, the 26th president of the United States refused to shoot a black bear cub when hunting. Instead, he adopted the bear.

Theodore (“Teddy”) Roosevelt was popular so a toy bear was created to celebrate the event. And so was made the famous Teddy (Roosevelt) Bear. Do you have one? Another famous bear was Smoky the Bear which was a black bear cub that was found after a forest fire had singed its fur and destroyed its woodland home. The United States Forest Service adopted Smoky as their mascot for their campaign against forest fires, started by careless campers.

The Grizzly Bear Skeleton

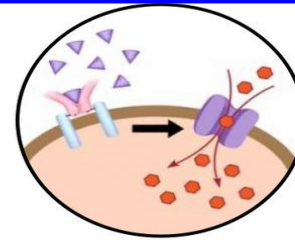
“The grizzly bear’s post-cranial skeleton reflects adaptations for both power and endurance. The skeleton supports a body mass that can exceed **360 kg** in adult males from salmon-rich populations (Hilderbrand et al. 1999) , enabling powerful locomotion whether running, digging, or swimming.”



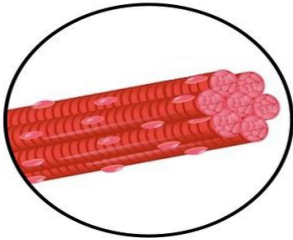

A BEAR'S BODY

Description

“Bears have a robust body with massive shoulder blades and a broad pelvis. To support their bulk, they have four short yet strong limbs with five toes on each paw. Their toes are modified into non-retractable claws that help in digging burrows, climbing, or tearing prey.

They have a plantigrade stance, meaning they walk with the whole foot on the ground (**like humans**), not on toes. Although they appear bulky, some bears, like the grizzly bear (**a subspecies of brown bear**), can run quite fast, reaching speed bursts of **35 mph (56 kmph)**.³

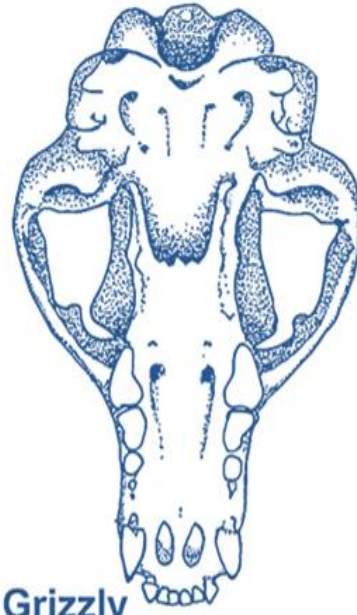
Their skull is large, having powerful jaw muscles, large canines mainly for display, and flat, crushing molars suited to their omnivorous lifestyle. Their ears are small and rounded to minimize heat loss.”

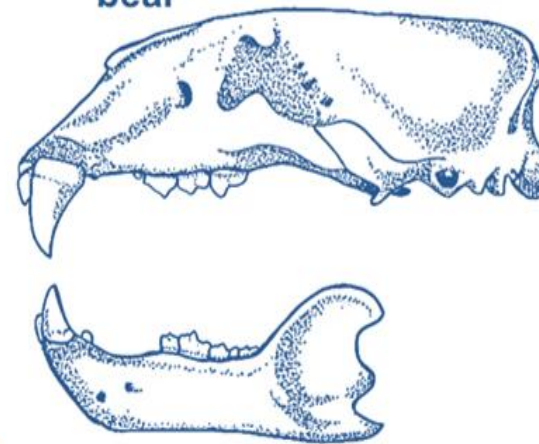
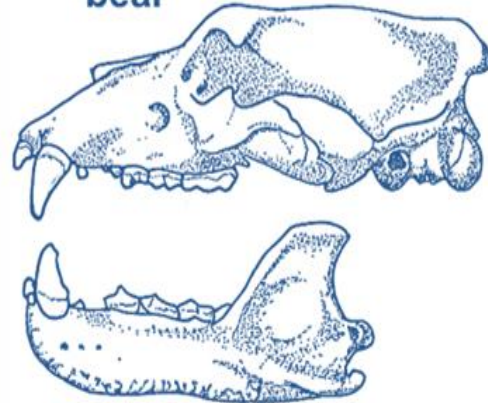
“Generally, bears are considered carnivorous. However, there are some variations amongst the species, and only the polar bear is a true carnivore.”

“The polar bear is the only species that can be classified as carnivorous. Most species are omnivores, and there’s the herbivorous giant panda.”

A BEAR'S BODY

“Although the muzzle lacks sensory whiskers, bears have an extraordinary sense of smell, which they use to detect food and communicate.

In fact, a brown bear's sense of smell is around **2,100 times** better than ours. It has a massive olfactory bulb (**5 to 7 times larger than ours**) in the brain and millions of scent receptors lining its nasal cavities.

Their bodies are covered with a coat of long, coarse guard hairs and short, dense underfur that traps air for insulation in winter. A thinner coat replaces this winter coat during summer.

Polar bears, in particular, have hollow, translucent guard hairs that absorb heat from the sun and keep them warm. They also have a thick layer of blubber under their skin for insulation.”

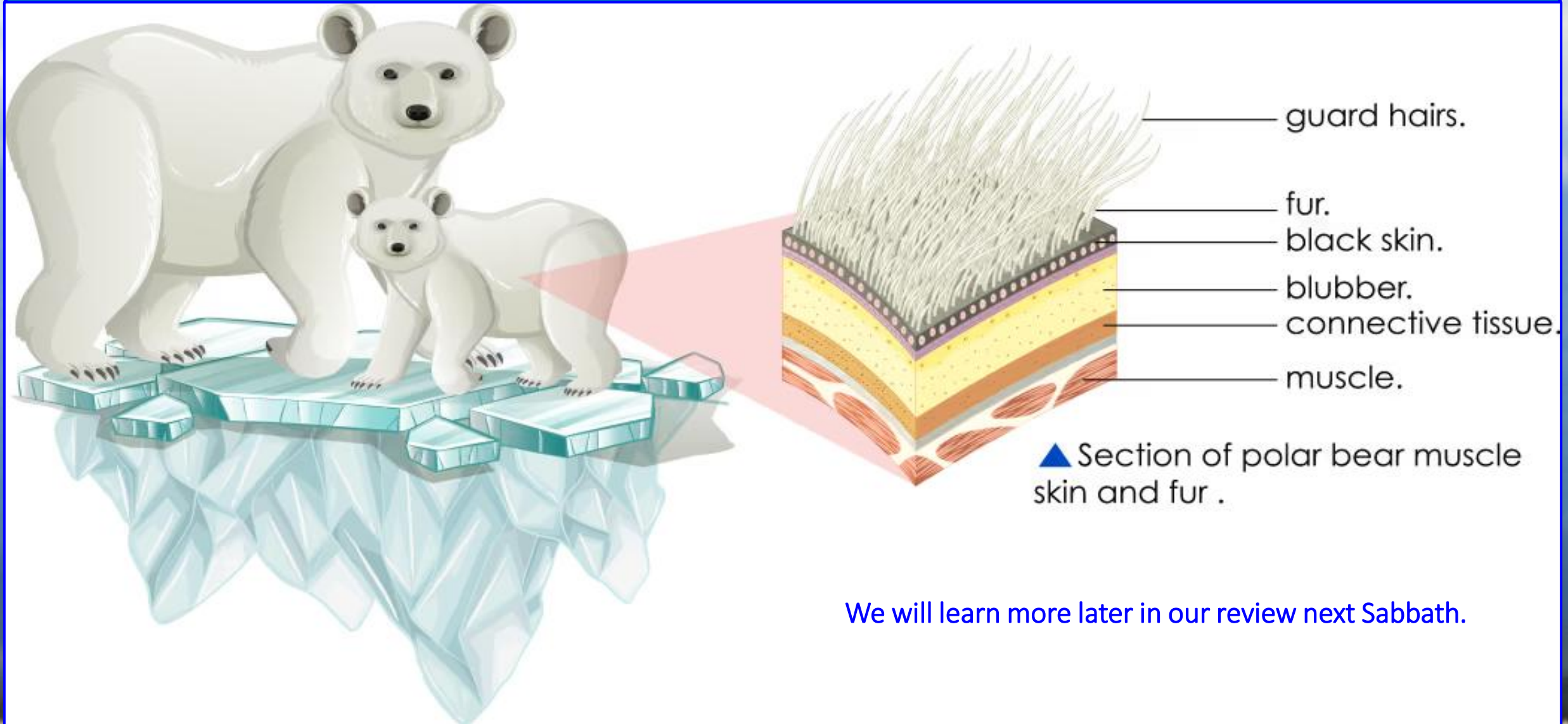

Our First Word is, “A Country”

COUNTRY, n. [L., land adjacent to a city. Hence the citizen says, let us go into the country.

8. A place of residence; a region of permanent habitation.

Our Second Word is, “Inheritance!”

INHERITANCE, n. An estate derived from an ancestor to an heir by succession or in course of law; or an estate which the law casts on a child or other person, as the representative of the deceased ancestor.

1. The reception of an estate by hereditary right, or the descent by which an estate or title is cast on the heir; as, the heir received the estate by inheritance.

2. The estate or possession which may descend to an heir, though it has not descended.

And Rachel and Leah answered and said, is there yet any portion or inheritance for us in our father's house?

3. An estate given or possessed by donation or divine appropriation. **Numbers 26:53-55.**

4. That which is possessed or enjoyed. Ask of me, and I will give thee the heathen for thine inheritance. **Psalm 2:8.**

“O Tower of the flock, the stronghold of the daughter of Zion, unto Thee shall it come, even the first dominion.”

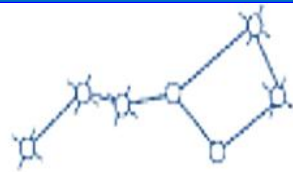
Micah 4:8. The time has come to which holy men have looked with longing since the flaming sword barred the first pair from Eden, the time for “the redemption of the purchased possession.” **Ephesians 1:14.** The earth originally given to man as his kingdom, betrayed by him into the hands of Satan, and so long held by the mighty foe, has been brought back by the great plan of redemption. “The righteous shall inherit the land, and dwell therein forever.” **Psalm 37:29.** {GC - The Great Controversy 674.3}

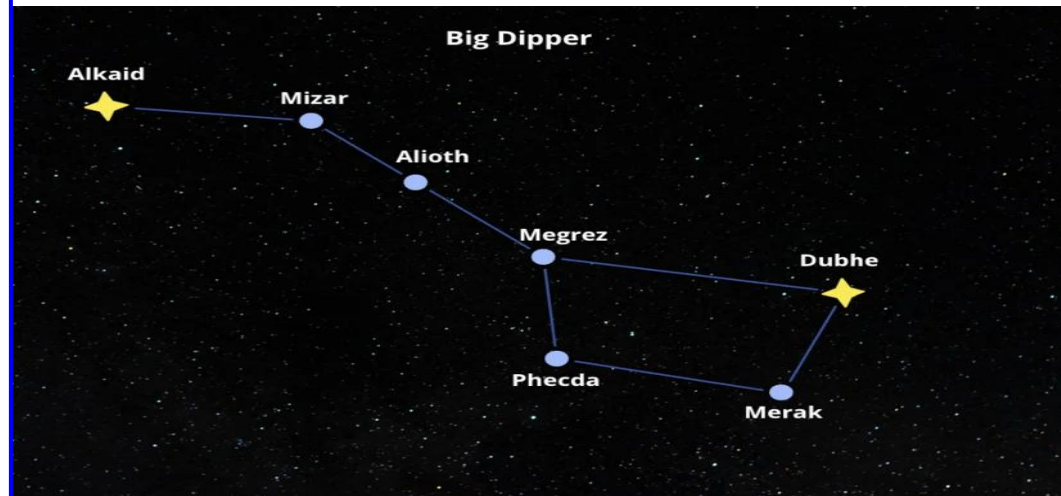
There are two constellations in the northern hemisphere that will help you to find the North Star. These are the Big Dipper and the Little Dipper. The seven stars in the Big Dipper form a cup with a long handle on it which looks something like a ladle. People used to use dip-pers (long-handled cups) to drink their freshly-drawn well water with right from the bucket.

It is easy to see the Big Dipper on a clear night if you face north. The two stars on the cup or bowl part opposite the handle point di-rectly to the polestar. If you connect these pointers with an imaginary line and run it out from the top of the bowl as far as about five times the distance between the pointers you will find the polestar. The pole-star is an object lesson of Jesus, our Heavenly Guiding Star. Five times the distance between the pointers to the polestar can remind you that five is the number of grace, and it is only through grace that we can find Jesus.

Our Third Word is, "Great Bear!"



Big Dipper



The Dippers



The polestar just happens to be the last star in the handle of the Little Dipper. The Little Dipper re-volves around the Polestar and the Big Dipper also circles around the same spot, making a complete circle in 24 hours. During the night the Big Dipper swings halfway around the sky and then it com-pletes the circle during the daytime. This perfect timing reminds us that like the stars in the vast circuit of their appointed path, God's purpos-es know no haste and no delay. You can actually learn to tell what time it is at night if you get acquainted with the position of the Big Dipper because it is like an hour hand on the clock with the Polestar being the center point of the clock face. This reminds me how others should look at us and tell what time it is in this earth's history. Are you **alert** to how late the hour is?

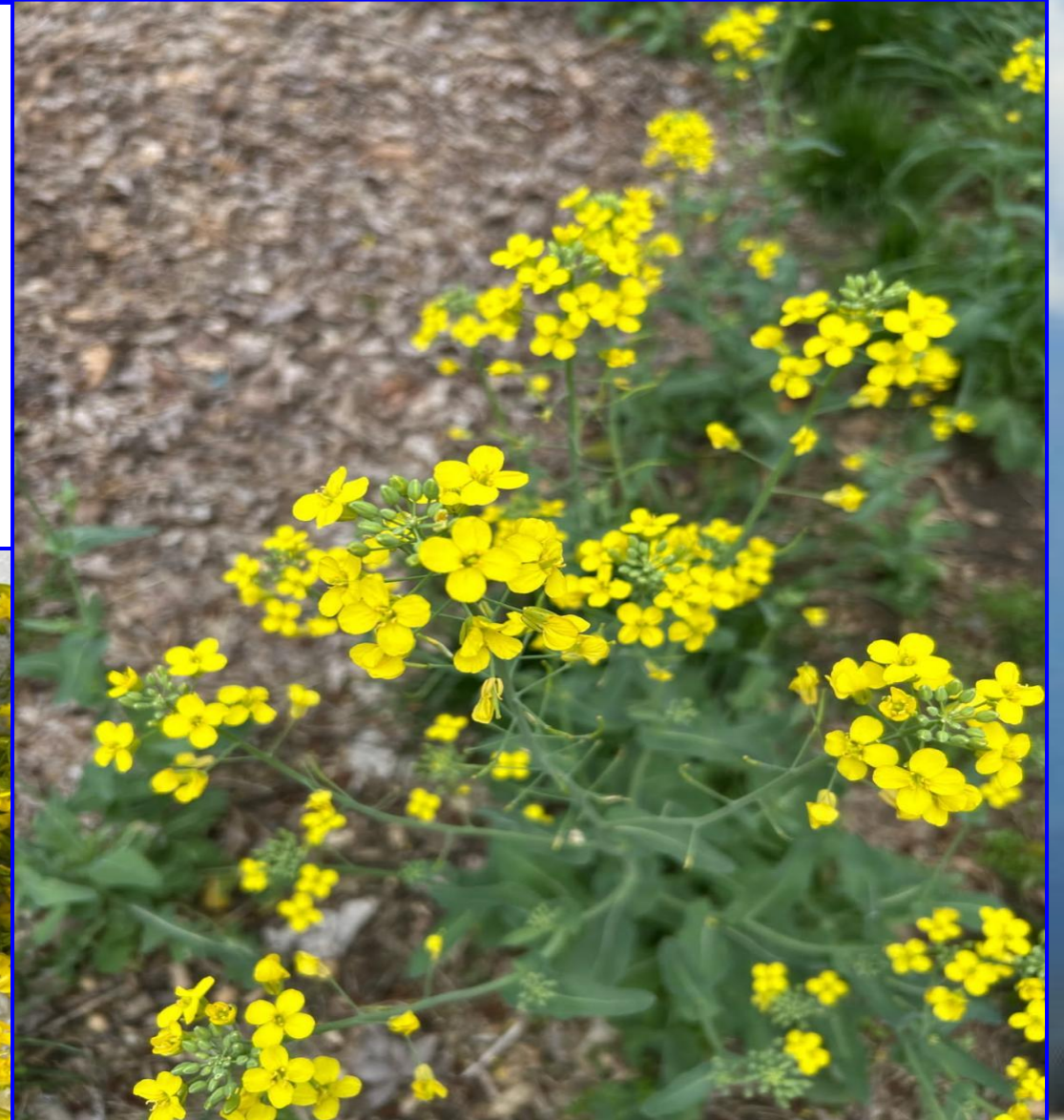

“**Northern Cardinals** are frequently spotted in Berea and surrounding Northeast Ohio areas, particularly at backyard feeders, due to their non-migratory nature and year-round presence. Recent sightings in Ohio (**April 2026**) confirm their presence, with males showing bright plumage and engaging in territorial behavior.”



Overview

“The cardinal (**Cardinalis cardinalis**) is the state bird of Ohio. It is well known for its rich, distinctive call. The cardinal's song is usually a repetition of short whistled phrases with some notes run together; for instance: What-cheer-cheer-cheer, or Who-it, who-it, who-it, or Birdy, birdy, birdy. There is also a sharp clink sound the bird makes as a call note. Cardinals can usually be found singing near the top of the tallest tree in their territory.”

Bear bodies

Each part of a bear's body has a special job to do.

Snout

Bears use their noses the way people use their eyes – to get information. Large nostrils sniff the air to find food.

Teeth

Bears have 42 teeth. Some teeth are flat for chewing plants. Others are sharp for tearing meat.

Claws

Sharp claws are always out, ready to work.

Body fat

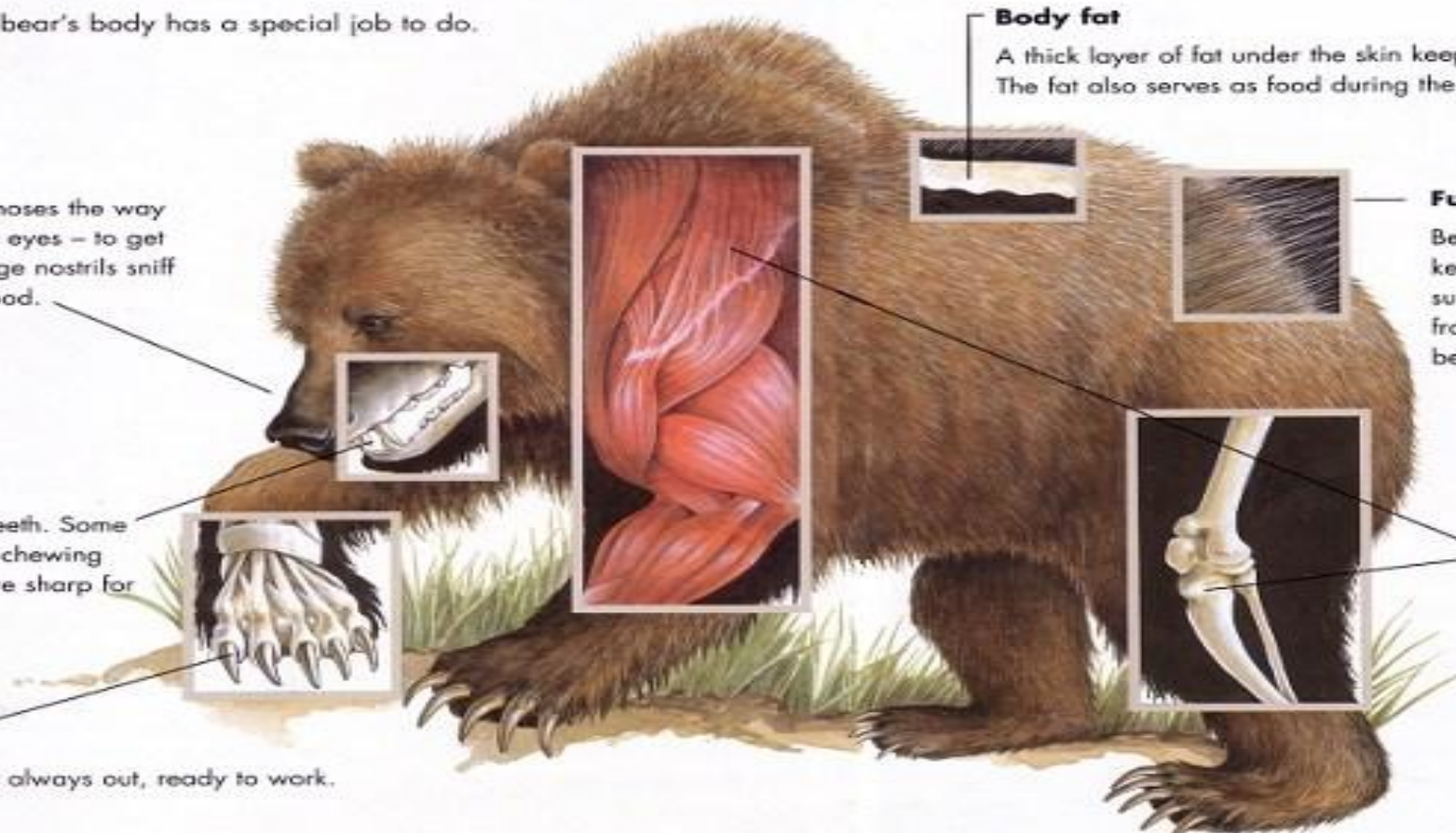
A thick layer of fat under the skin keeps the bear warm over the winter. The fat also serves as food during the bear's long winter sleep.

Fur

Bears have two kinds of fur. Soft underfur keeps the bear warm in winter and cool in summer. Long guard hair protects the bear from insects and dirt. The colour helps the bear blend in with its surroundings.

Muscles and bones

Heavy bones and thick muscles make a bear strong.
