Bear bodies

Each part of a bear's body has a special job to do.

Snout

Bears use their noses the way people use their eyes – to get information. Large nostrils sniff the air to find food.

Teeth

Bears have 42 teeth. Some teeth are flat for chewing plants. Others are sharp for tearing meat.

Claws

Sharp claws are always out, ready to work.

Body fat

A thick layer of fat under the skin keeps the bear warm over the winter. The fat also serves as food during the bear's long winter sleep.

Fur

Bears have two kinds of fur. Soft underfur keeps the bear warm in winter and cool in summer. Long guard hair protects the bear from insects and dirt. The colour helps the bear blend in with its surroundings.

Muscles and bones

Heavy bones and thick muscles make a bear strong.

The Response

“Christ did not immediately reply to the woman’s request. He received this representative of a despised race as the Jews would have done. In this He designed that His disciples should be impressed with the cold and heartless manner in which the Jews would treat such a case, as evinced by His reception of the woman, and the compassionate manner in which He would have them deal with such distress, as manifested by His subsequent granting of her petition.



“But although Jesus did not reply, the woman did not lose faith. As He passed on, as if not hearing her, she followed Him, continuing her supplications. Annoyed by her importunities, the disciples asked Jesus to send her away. They saw that their Master treated her with indifference, and they therefore supposed that the prejudice of the Jews against the Canaanites was pleasing to Him. But it was a pitying



Saviour to whom the woman made her plea, and in answer to the request of the disciples, Jesus said, *'I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel.'* Although this answer appeared to be in accordance with the prejudice of the Jews, it was an implied rebuke to the disciples, which they afterward understood as reminding them of what He had often told them—that He came to the world to save all who would accept Him." 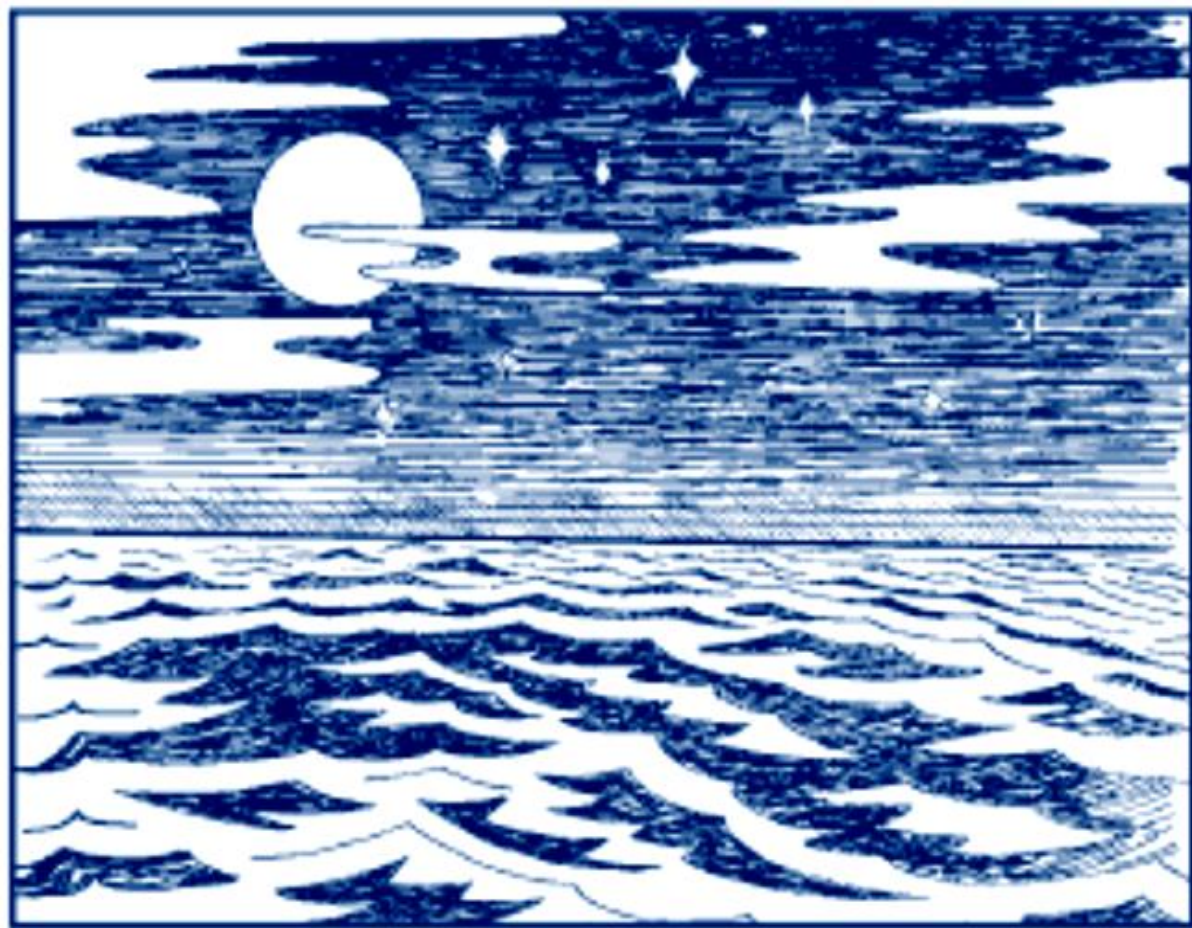

“A Country” in Scripture & Spirit of Prophecy

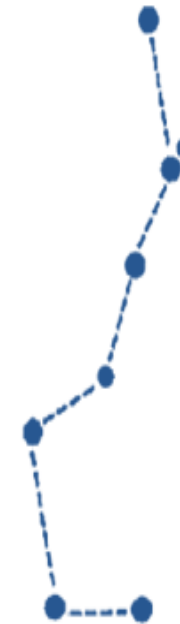

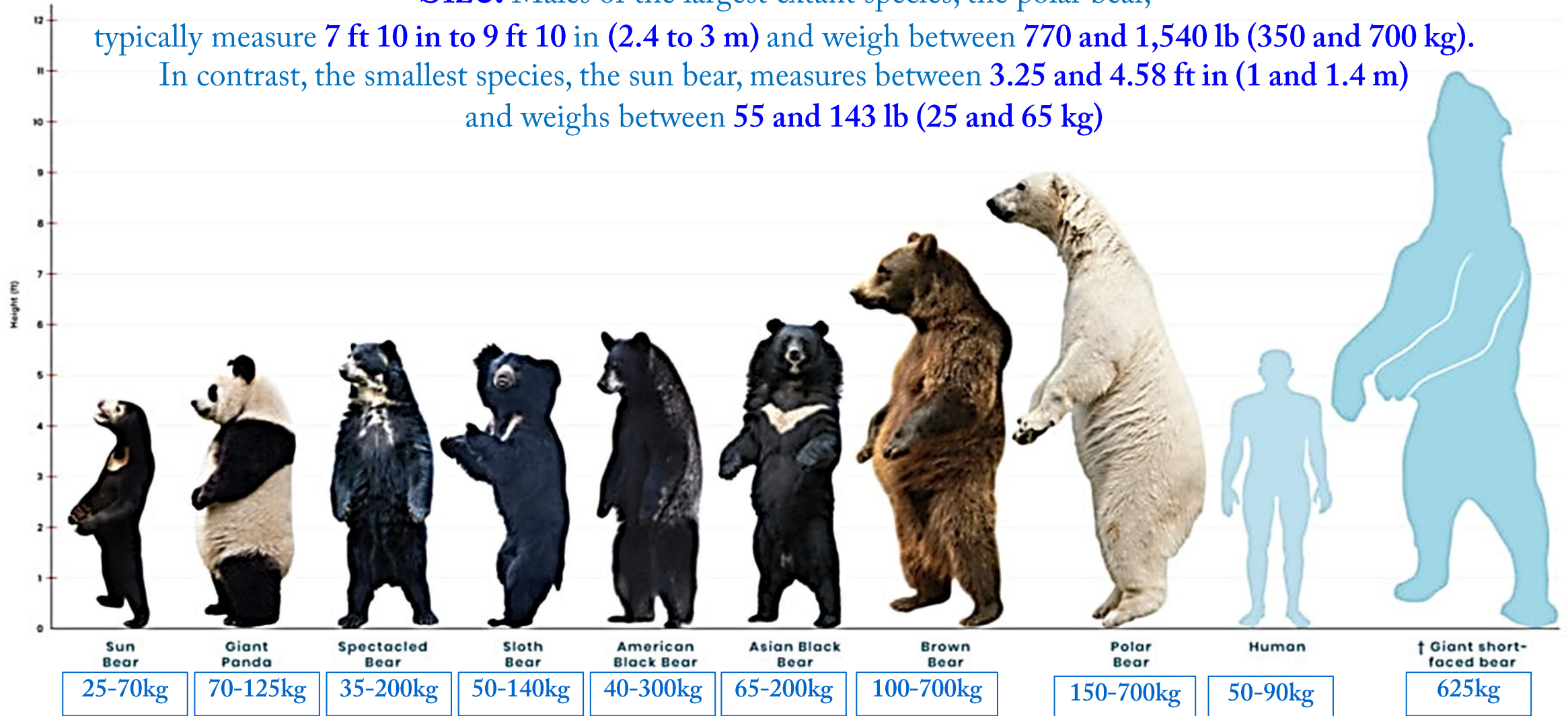
This image compares the sizes of all 8 extant bear species along with an average human and an extinct prehistoric bear

Size: Males of the largest extant species, the polar bear,

typically measure 7 ft 10 in to 9 ft 10 in (2.4 to 3 m) and weigh between 770 and 1,540 lb (350 and 700 kg).

In contrast, the smallest species, the sun bear, measures between 3.25 and 4.58 ft in (1 and 1.4 m)

and weighs between 55 and 143 lb (25 and 65 kg)

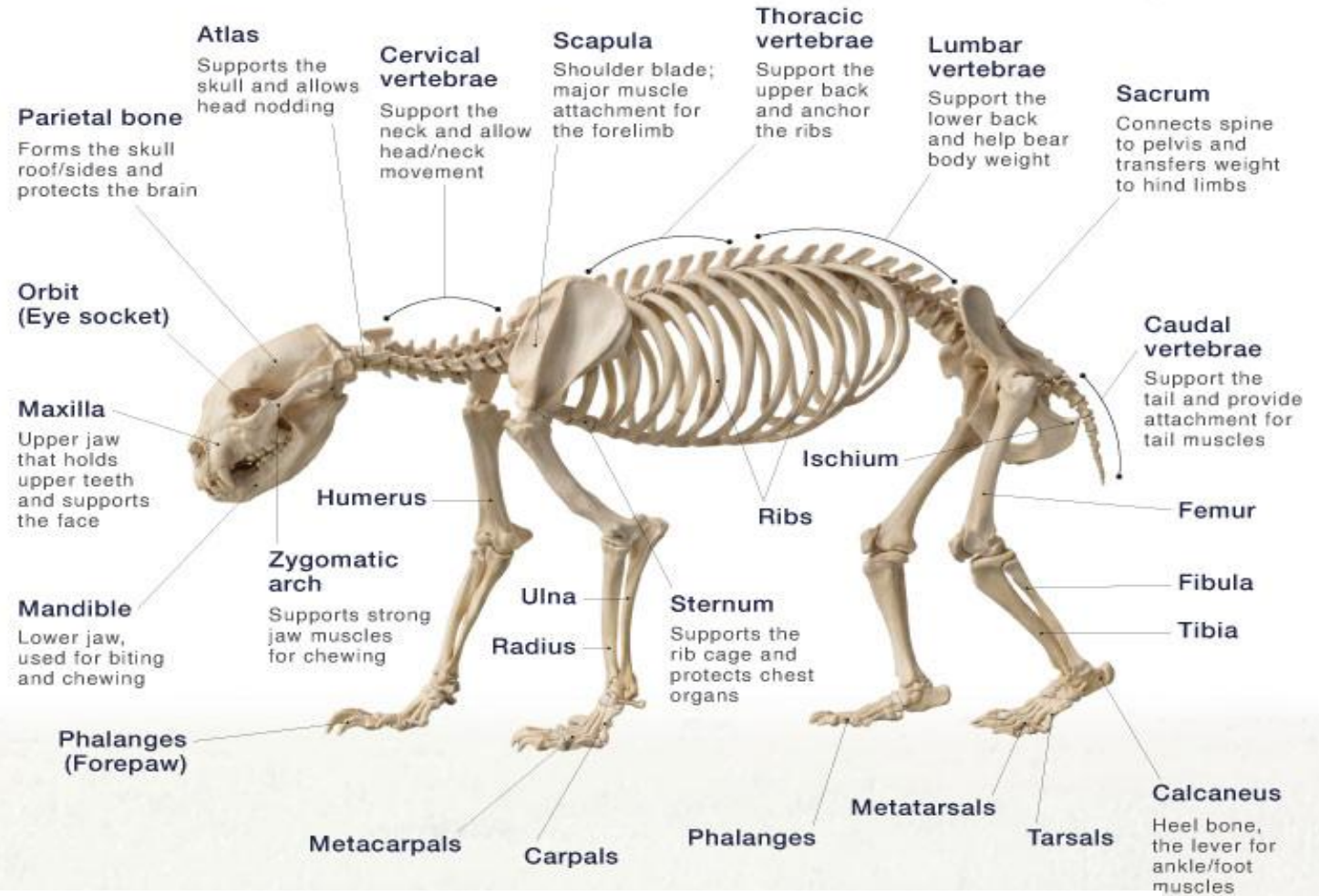
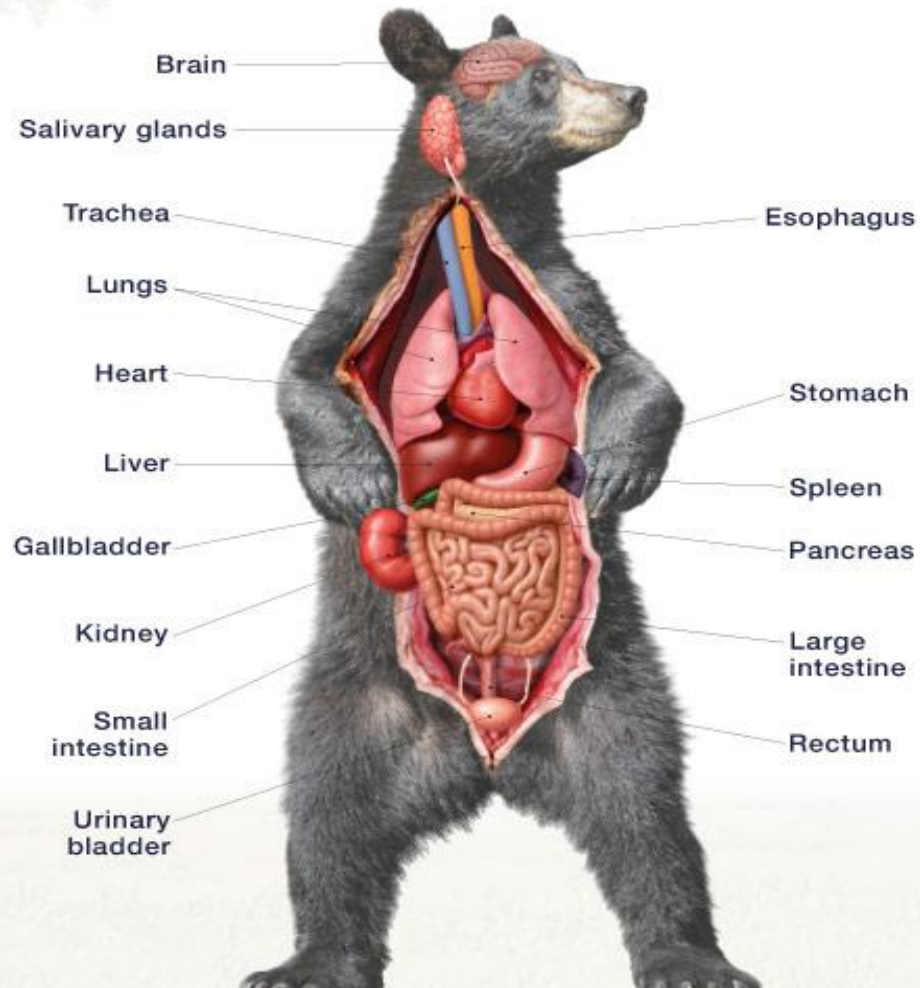
**This image shows an American black bear (Ursus americanus) as a representative species*

The image shows an American black bear (*Ursus americanus*) as a representative species, illustrating its organ system and skeletal framework

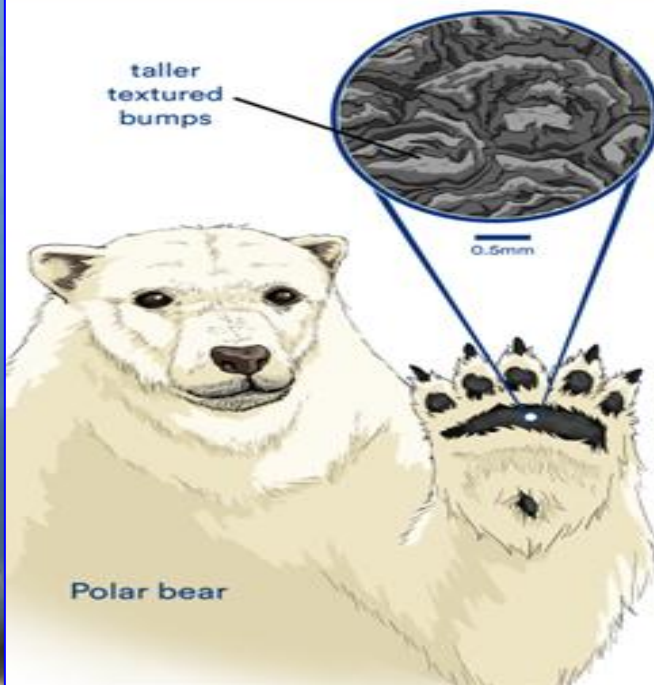

POLAR BEAR ANATOMY: FUR & SKIN VECTOR IMAGE REVIEW!

“Polar bears are well-adapted to their Arctic home. Their white fur helps them blend with the snow and ice. Underneath their fur they have black skin, which absorbs heat from the sun. They also have a thick layer of fat to keep them warm. The bottom of their paws also has fur, which protects their feet from the cold and keeps them from slipping on the ice.”



“Polar bears have special features that help them live in the Arctic. One feature is their all-white color, which helps them blend in with ice and snow. Another feature is fur on the bottom of their feet. This fur helps polar bears to walk across slippery ice. Naturally, the fur also keeps their feet warm.”

BEAR SENSE OF SMELL! REVIEW

“A grizzly bear can smell **2100** times better than a human, making them the world’s, ultimate, sniffing machine. A bear’s olfactory bulb, which manages the sense of smell, is **5 X** larger than ours, even though its brain is **1/3** of the size, its long snout is lined with tens of millions of odor-sensitive nerves and its nose contains hundreds of tiny muscles that can be manipulated with the same dexterity as our fingers. Smelling as a bear does, might be like touching and feeling something at a distance.

Bears can detect a carcass of an animal, in perfect conditions, up to **20 miles** away. Polar bears have followed seals for up to **40 miles**. Think how easily a bear can smell your fear...your uneasiness ...even your busy, babbling mind. This ability makes them a very intimidating, **800 pound**, scavenging, bully of the forest, but we can learn how to understand their language, so let’s start with the language of their noses.”



CONTINUING: BEAR SENSE OF SMELL! REVIEW

“A brown bear’s hearing and vision are believed to be similar to ours. Their night vision is enhanced by a reflective lining along the back of their eyeball that bounces light back through the retina.

It’s a bear’s sense of smell that really sets them apart!

A bear’s sense of smell is seven times better than a bloodhound’s and **2,100** times better than ours! The secret to this super sniffing ability? A bear’s olfactory bulb (the area of the brain that manages smell) is at least five times larger than ours and their vast nasal cavity, structured like a honeycomb, is lined with millions of scent receptors.

These adaptations allow a bear to sniff out food, cubs, a mate or danger up to two miles (**three kilometers**) away! Because of their reliance on smell, bears use scent to communicate with other bears.

Cubs learn the scent of their mother and adult bears use their scent to announce their presence in an area or their interest in a mate.”



A BEAR'S BODY INACTIVITY REVIEW!

“Hibernation is a way that some animals deal with the harshness of winter. They curl up in a safe place and stay there until winter ends. Hibernating animals seem almost dead. They barely breathe, and their body temperature is near the freezing mark. In warmer weather they return to their regular activities.

Animals that hibernate are called hibernators. They include bats, hedgehogs, ground squirrels, groundhogs, and marmots.

In the autumn most bears eat a lot to put on extra fat. They then sleep through most of the winter. This is similar to a very deep resting state called hibernation. But bears are not true hibernators.

“Their body temperature, heartbeat rate, and breathing rate do not drop much lower than normal.”



IN CONCLUSION: A BEAR'S BODY

Behavior

“These animals are mostly solitary and live and forage alone, except for mothers with cubs or during mating season. Depending on the species, they may be diurnal or nocturnal. **For example**, brown and American black bears are generally diurnal, but sloth bears are mostly nocturnal.

In winter, bears living in colder northern regions of their range hibernate in their dens, particularly to battle the scarcity of resources. During this phase, their metabolism slows down, and body temperature decreases by **7.2 to 12.6 °F (4 to 7 °C)**. Their heart rate slows from about the usual **55** to as low as **9 beats** per minute.¹⁰ Depending on the species, bears may hibernate for **3 to 8 months**.”

MUSTARD REVIEW! PART 1

“Harvesting Mustard Greens and Seed

The methods you use will change depending on whether you are harvesting the leaves or the seeds of the mustard plant.

Harvesting Mustard Greens

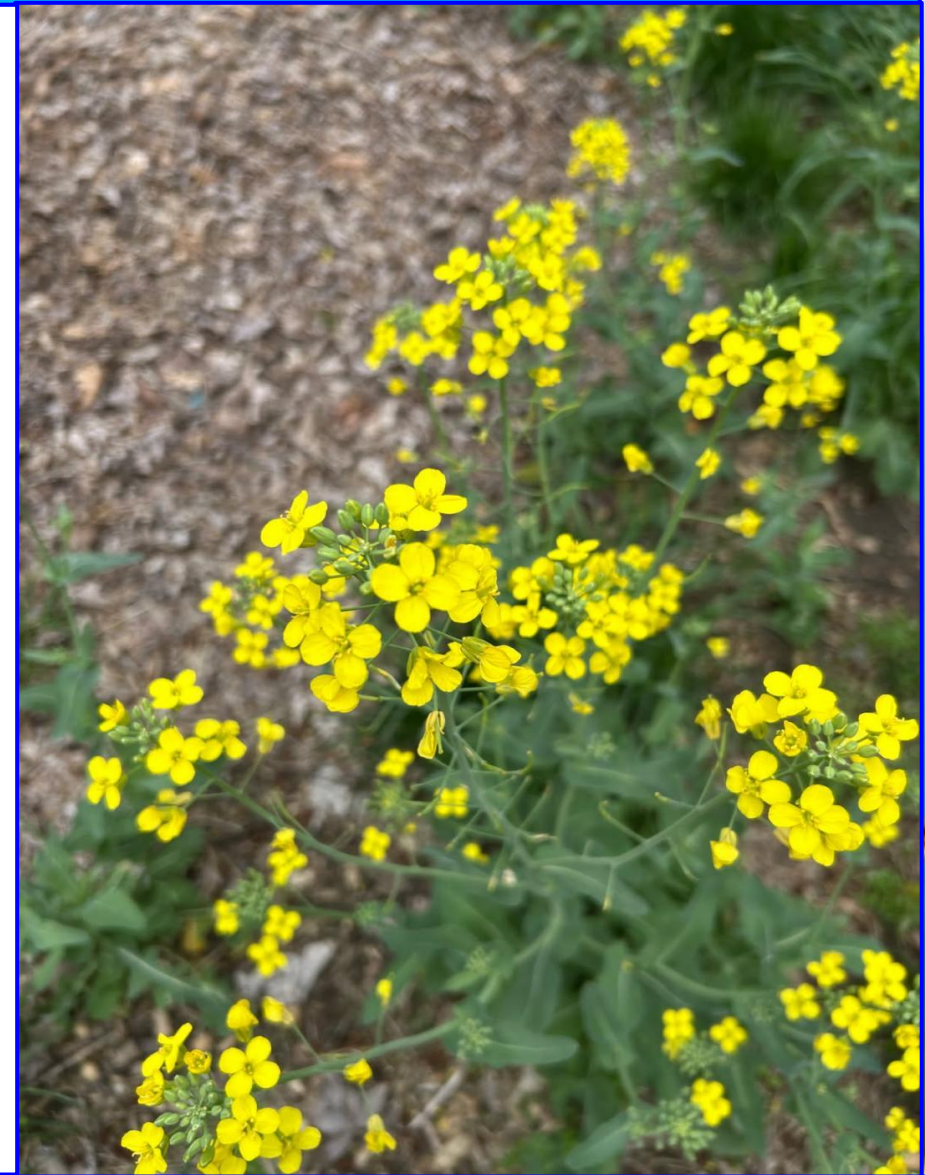
For salads, harvest the mustard greens when they are small, young, and tender. For sautéing or stewing, let the leaves grow to their full mature size but harvest them before a seed stalk forms.

Cut the large outside leaves at the base without damaging the growing point. Even if you don't use the large leaves, remove them anyway to make room for the small, more tender inner leaves that will continue to grow. The leaves will regrow even after cutting them repeatedly.

Harvesting mustard after the first frost is not a problem, in fact, the flavor of the greens even becomes sweeter with a light frost.

Harvesting Mustard Seeds

Watch the plants closely after the bloom to catch the point in time when the seed pods turn from green to brown but aren't open yet because otherwise, they will disperse the seeds all over your garden.”



MUSTARD REVIEW! PART 2

“Either cut off the branches with the mature seed pods or remove the entire plants.

Place an old sheet on the ground, which makes it easier to gather any seeds and seed pods that fall off the plants.

Air-dry the pods on a tray lined with an old sheet or on a fine screen for **about 2 weeks**.

Alternatively, place them in paper bags and hang them in a warm, dry place. The seed pods are ready for further processing or storage when they are completely dry and crispy.

All species of mustard plants, both wild mustards and cultivated mustards, are edible, though some are tastier, easier to prepare, and more commonly used than others.

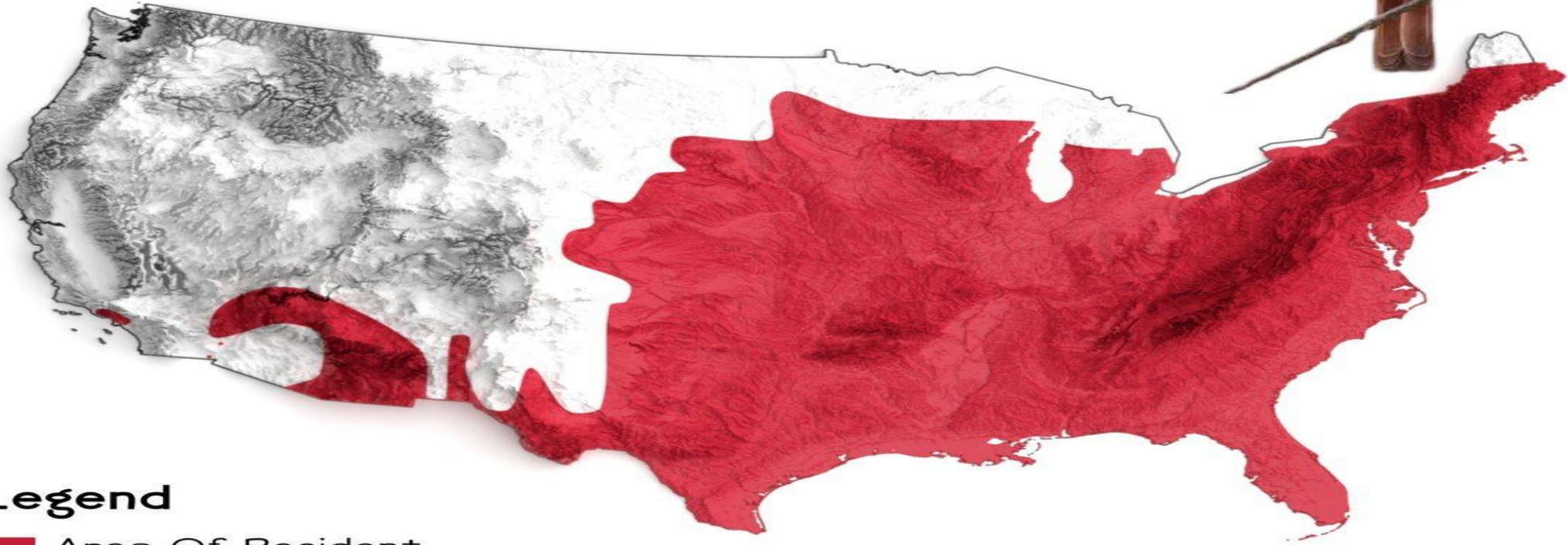
Most mustard leaves can be eaten either raw or cooked. However, eating mustard seeds raw without any soaking, cooking, or other preparation is not recommended because of the bitter flavor.”

NORTHERN CARDINALS REVIEW! PART 2

Basic Description

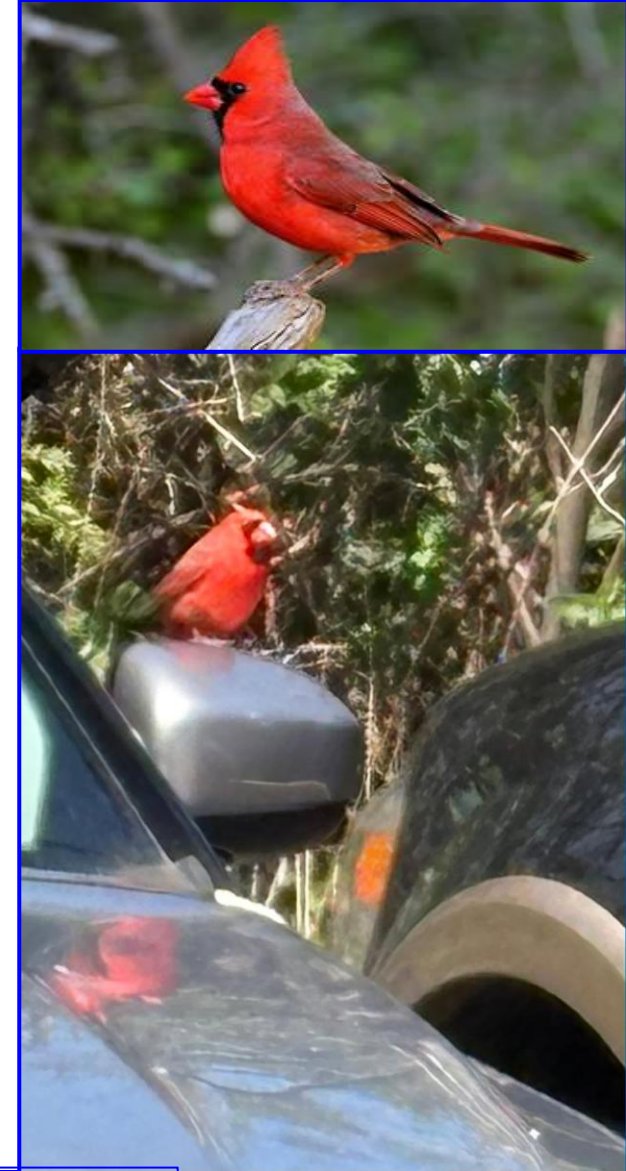
“The male Northern Cardinal is perhaps responsible for getting more people to open up a field guide than any other bird. They’re a perfect combination of familiarity, conspicuousness, and style: a shade of red you can’t take your eyes off. Even the brown females sport a sharp crest and warm red accents. Cardinals don’t migrate and they don’t molt into a dull plumage, so they’re still breathtaking in winter’s snowy backyards. In summer, their sweet whistles are one of the first sounds of the morning.”

Interesting Facts

Only a few female North American songbirds sing, but the female Northern Cardinal does, and often while sitting on the nest. This may give the male information about when to bring food to the nest. A mated pair shares song phrases, but the female may sing a longer and slightly more complex song than the male.

Many people are perplexed each spring by the sight of a cardinal attacking its reflection in a window, car mirror, or shiny bumper. Both males and females do this, and most often in spring and early summer when they are obsessed with defending their territory against any intruders. Birds may spend hours fighting these intruders without giving up.

A few weeks later, as levels of aggressive hormones subside, these attacks should end (though one female kept up this behavior every day or so for six months without stopping).”

Continuing: “The woman urged her case with increased earnestness, bowing at Christ's feet, and crying, “Lord, help me.” Jesus, still apparently rejecting her entreaties, according to the unfeeling prejudice of the Jews, answered, “It is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast it to dogs.”

This was virtually asserting that it was not just to lavish the blessings brought to the favored people of God upon strangers and aliens from Israel.

This answer would have utterly discouraged a less earnest seeker.

But the woman saw that her opportunity had come.

Beneath the apparent refusal of Jesus, she saw a compassion that He could not hide.

“Truth, Lord,” she answered, “yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table.”

While the children of the household eat at the father's table, even the dogs are not left unfed.

They have a right to the crumbs that fall from the table abundantly supplied.

So while there were many blessings given to Israel, was there not also a blessing for her?

She was looked upon as a dog, and had she not then a dog's claim to a crumb from His bounty? **{DA 401.1}**

Continuing: Jesus had just departed from His field of labor because the scribes and Pharisees were seeking to take His life. They murmured and complained.

They manifested unbelief and bitterness, and refused the salvation so freely offered them. Here Christ meets one of an unfortunate and despised race, that has not been favored with the light of God's word; yet she yields at once to the divine influence of Christ, and has implicit faith in His ability to grant the favor she asks.

She begs for the crumbs that fall from the Master's table.

If she may have the privilege of a dog, she is willing to be regarded as a dog.

She has no national or religious prejudice or pride to influence her course, and she immediately acknowledges Jesus as the Redeemer, and as being able to do all that she asks of Him.

{DA 401.2}

The Saviour is satisfied. He has tested her faith in Him.

By His dealings with her, He has shown that she who has been regarded as an outcast from Israel is no longer an alien, but a child in God's household.

As a child it is her privilege to share in the Father's gifts.

Christ now grants her request, and finishes the lesson to the disciples.

Turning to her with a look of pity and love, He says, "O woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt." From that hour her daughter became whole.

The demon troubled her no more.

The woman departed, acknowledging her Saviour, and happy in the granting of her prayer."

{DA 401.3}

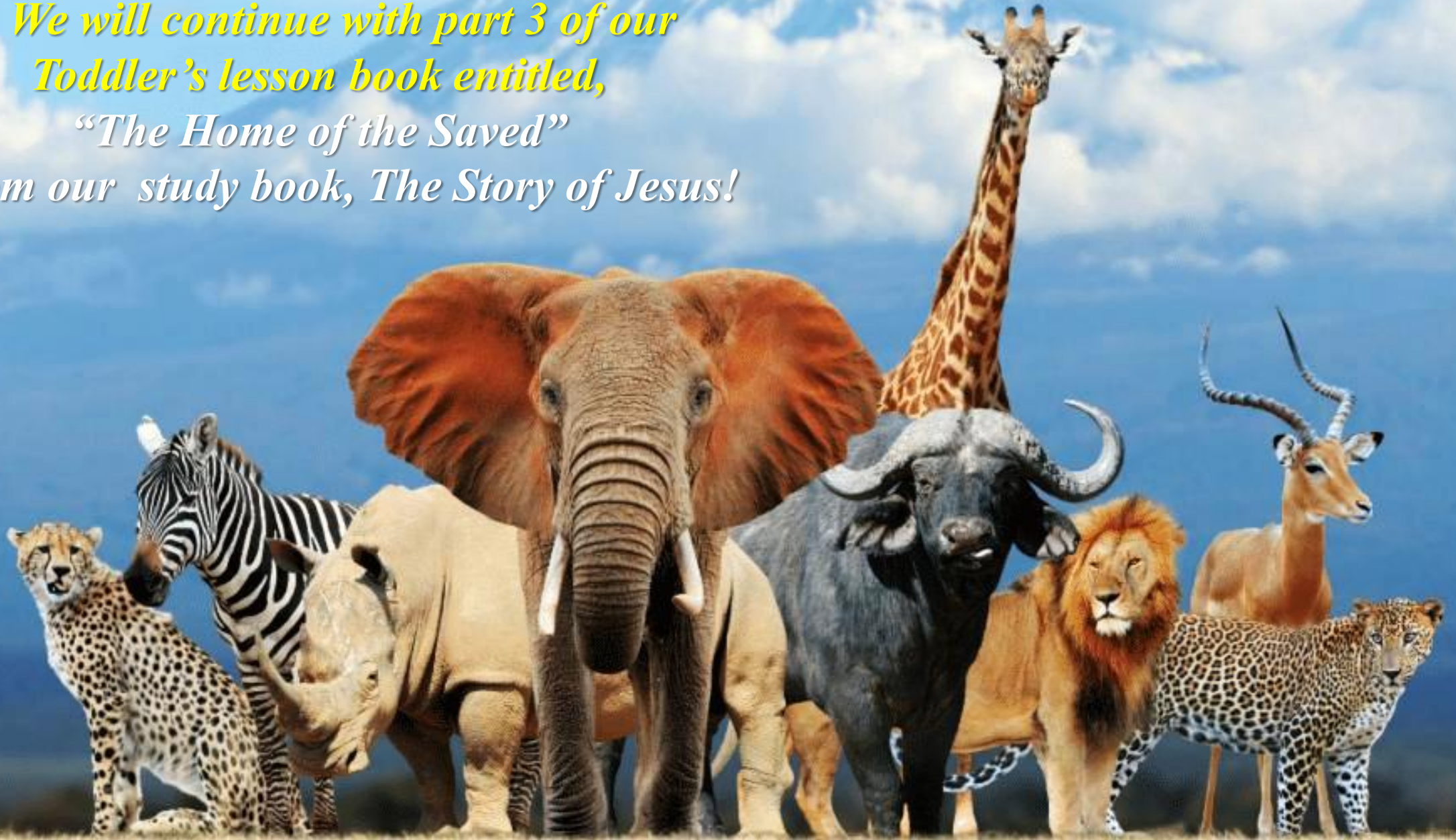
