Nature

Bear Cubs

Usually bear cubs are born during the mother's winter sleep. Israel was asleep to the needs of people around them. Most of the time the 400 pound (180 kilogram) female bear has two cubs but she can have from one to four. They weigh about 1/2 to 1 pound (0.23 to 0.5 kilograms) at birth and are about the size of a kitten. They are born blind and are covered with very fine hair when they are born. They look naked. The cold weather outside the den does not bother the new cubs, for mother's body heat keeps them warm and cozy and in good health. They grow very quickly.



Their eyes open in about a month after birth and by then the body is covered with hair. In the spring the hungry mother and her frisky, playful cubs leave the den. On the first day out they may even climb a tree. Bear cubs love to play. They roll in the grass, chase an insect, and wrestle with one another. Exercise is good for a healthy cub. If they are disobedient, mother may give them a cuff. Spankings make the cubs bawl, but they need discipline because

Mother teaches her cubs which plants to eat, and how to break open an ant hill. They learn to gather berries with their claws. They go swimming and tree climbing. They learn that trees are a good place to find fruit or to escape from their enemies, the wolf and the mountain lion. A cub would probably not survive if it lost its mother. It would not do nearly so well if it had to learn everything by its own experience rather than learning by building on the experience of its mother. Things the cub must learn from its mother are: fear of its enemies, to avoid man, and to prepare for its long winter rest. These important lessons remind us about what Jesus was trying to teach the disciples. They



must learn that pride and prejudice were enemies to be avoided. Their work was to prepare all men for the long rest God wanted them to take in heaven. Jesus was demonstrating the right way to live and treat others so the disciples could learn to imitate His behavior and attitudes, even as the cubs copy their mother's example. Jesus is the only perfect example of mental **health** this world has ever seen.



As the mother bear teaches her cubs how to live in the world, so Jesus was teaching His disciples about the needs of the people around Israel. By autumn the cubs weigh about 40 pounds (18 kilograms). Mother bear takes good care of her cubs, risking her own **health** and life. Mother bear will fight if she thinks her cubs are in danger. No one wants to tangle with an angry mother bear. It can remind us how God was concerned with the Jews for not treating His heathen children properly, *"I will meet them as a bear that is bereaved of her whelps"* (Hosea 13:8). At the first sign of danger mother bear will chase her young cubs up a tree. As the bear cares for her cubs, so Jesus took care of the needs of the



woman. He delivered her child from the enemy, Satan, even as a mother bear put to flight the enemy of her cubs. "He went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed by Satan. About them were whole villages where there was not a moan of sickness in any house; for He had passed through them, and **healed** all their sick." (*The Desire of Ages* 241)
A whole town in good **health**!



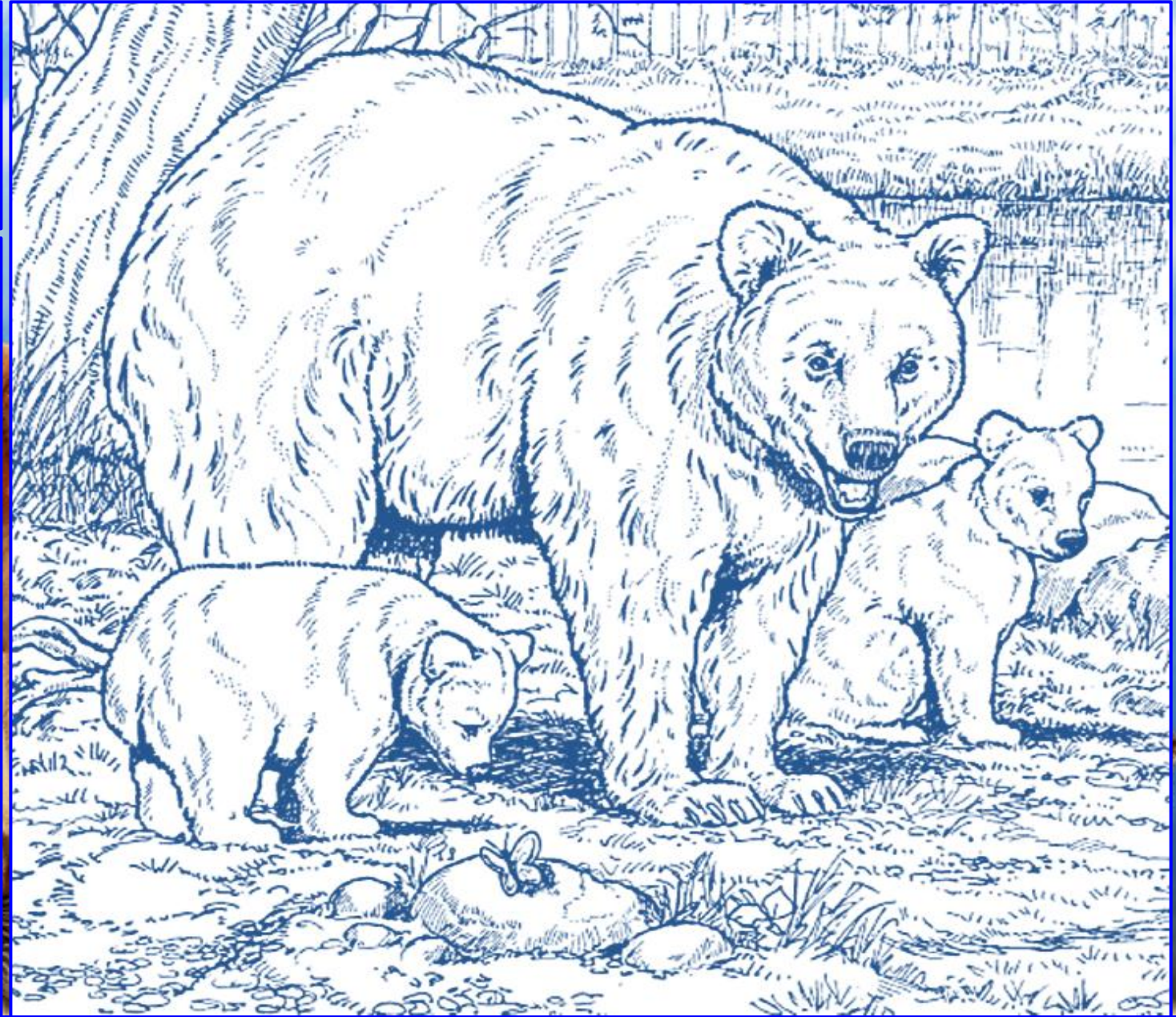
Bear cubs spend one more winter with their mother before they set off on their own. Some bears live to be thirty years old.

A newborn Kodiak brown bear can weigh less than one pound (1.2 kilogram).

As it grows however, its weight may increase about 1,000 times.

If a human baby grew this much, adult people could weigh over 6,000 pounds.

Brown Bear and Cubs





“Kodiak bear, (subspecies *Ursus arctos middendorffi*), subspecies of brown bear found only on Kodiak Island and nearby islands off the coast of Alaska. It can weigh up to **720 kg (1,600 pounds)** and is the world’s largest bear and the world’s largest land carnivore, titles it shares with the polar bear (*Ursus maritimus*), which grows to a similar size. Researchers estimate that the Kodiak bear population numbers about **3,500** animals.”

Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. As you care for animals that have babies, like a dog, cat, horse, cow, and sheep, be reminded of bear cubs and your lesson.
3. Notice how happy your dog is to get some table scraps and remember the joy of the Canaanite woman.



Reinforce

1. Look for bears! Use your guide book to identify them.
2. As a family, find out about the needs of those around you. Like in Israel, there may be neighbors with needs and you are unaware of them.
3. Find items that weigh 400 pounds (180 kilograms) like a mother bear, 1/2 pound to 1 pound (0.23 to 0.5 kilogram) like a newborn baby bear, 40 pounds (18 kilograms) like cubs in the autumn.
4. Climb a tree, follow a butterfly, roll in the grass, like a baby bear!
5. Say your memory verse!

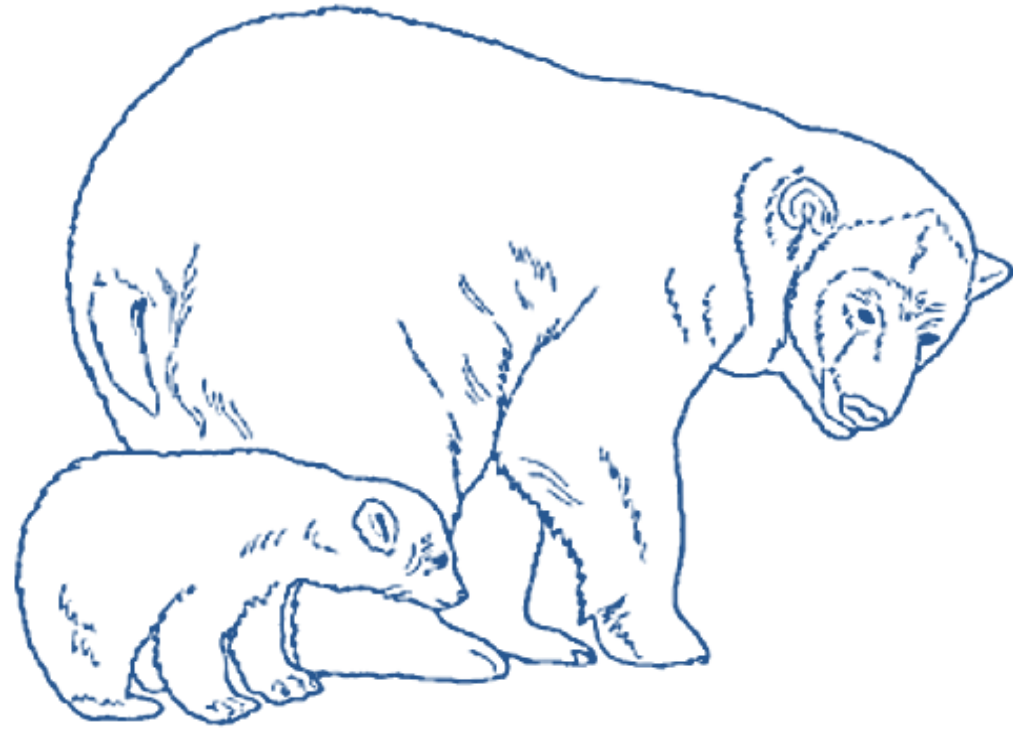

“Black bears are commonly found along the **Oregon Coast**, thriving in the region's dense forests and diverse ecosystems, with recent sightings increasing due to food scarcity.”

Habitat and Distribution

“Black bears (***Ursus americanus***) are the only bear species in Oregon, with an estimated population of **25,000 to 30,000**. They inhabit various regions, including the Coast Range, Cascade Mountains, and Blue Mountains. Along the Oregon Coast, these bears are often found in forested areas near streams and rivers, where they forage for food.”

“BEREAVE, v.t. pret. bereaved, bereft; pp. bereaved, bereft.

1. To deprive; to strip; to make destitute; with of before the thing taken away.
Me have ye bereaved of my children. **Genesis 42:36.**

“And Jacob their father said unto them, Me have ye bereaved [of my children]: Joseph [is] not, and Simeon [is] not, and ye will take Benjamin [away]: all these things are against me.”

It is sometimes used without of, and is particularly applied to express the loss of friends by death.

2. To take away from.

BEREAVED, pp. Deprived; stripped and left destitute.”

Our Second Word is, “Whelp!”

2. To interrupt or render imperfect the regular functions of the brain, or of the intellect; to disorder; to derange.
3. To infect; to communicate disease to, by contagion.
4. To pain; to make uneasy.

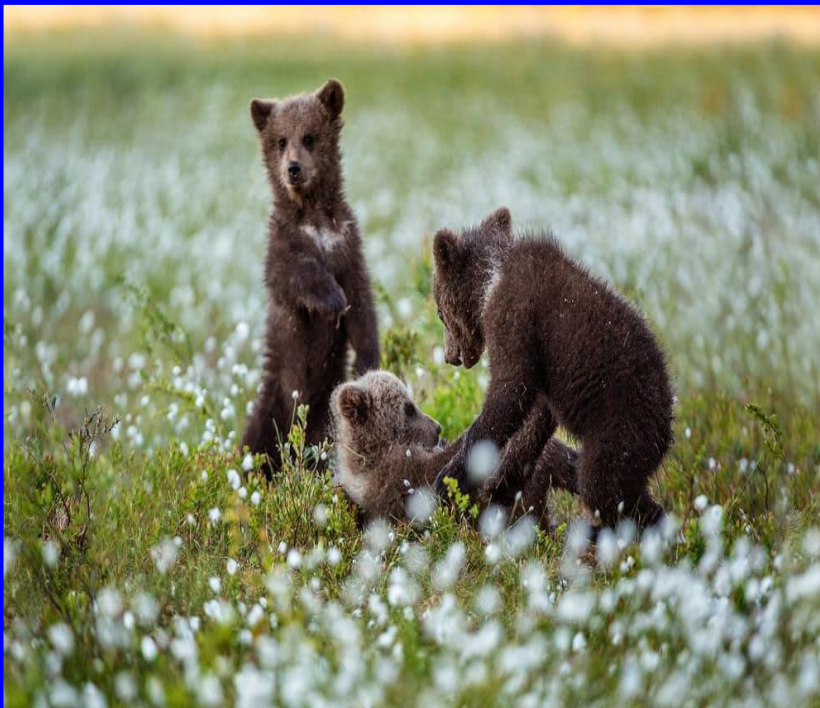

In this article, we’ll explore eleven heartwarming facts about bear cubs that highlight their vulnerability, resilience, and irresistible charm. These facts not only demonstrate the wonders of wildlife but also emphasize why these magnificent creatures deserve our protection and admiration.”



BEAR CUBS, PART 2

Bear Cubs Are Born Incredibly Small

“Despite their mothers’ impressive size, bear cubs enter the world as some of the smallest mammal babies relative to their adult size. Newborn black bear cubs typically weigh only **8-12 ounces (225-340 grams)**—about the size of a guinea pig—while their mothers can weigh up to **300 pounds**. Polar bear cubs are similarly tiny, weighing just **1-1.5 pounds (454-680 grams)** at birth, despite their mothers weighing up to 1,100 pounds. This remarkable size disparity represents one of the most extreme among mammals. The cubs’ small size allows mother bears to conserve energy during winter hibernation while still successfully reproducing, a fascinating evolutionary adaptation that helps ensure the species’ survival in challenging environments.”



BEAR CUBS, PART 3

Cubs Are Born Blind, Hairless, and Helpless

“Bear cubs enter the world in an extraordinarily vulnerable state—blind, nearly hairless, and completely dependent on their mothers. Their eyes remain closed for the **first 3-5 weeks of life**, and their ears are folded against their heads. This altricial state (**being born in an undeveloped condition**) contrasts sharply with their eventual status as powerful predators. During these first crucial weeks, cubs rely entirely on their mother’s body heat, milk, and protection. Their pink skin gradually develops a fine layer of fur, and they grow remarkably quickly on their mother’s rich milk. This dramatic transformation from helpless newborn to active cub in just a few weeks highlights the incredible developmental journey these animals undergo.”



IN CONCLUSION: BEAR CUBS

“The bond between a mother bear and her cubs represents one of the strongest maternal relationships in the animal kingdom. Female bears demonstrate remarkable dedication, caring for their cubs for up **to 2-3 years depending on the species**. During this time, the mother bear teaches essential survival skills, from finding food to avoiding predators. She will fiercely defend her offspring against any threat—including larger male bears that may pose a danger to the cubs. Mother bears have been observed putting themselves in considerable danger to protect their young, standing their ground against larger predators or human threats. This intensive parental investment helps explain why bears typically reproduce only every **2-4 years**, devoting significant energy to raising each litter to independence.”

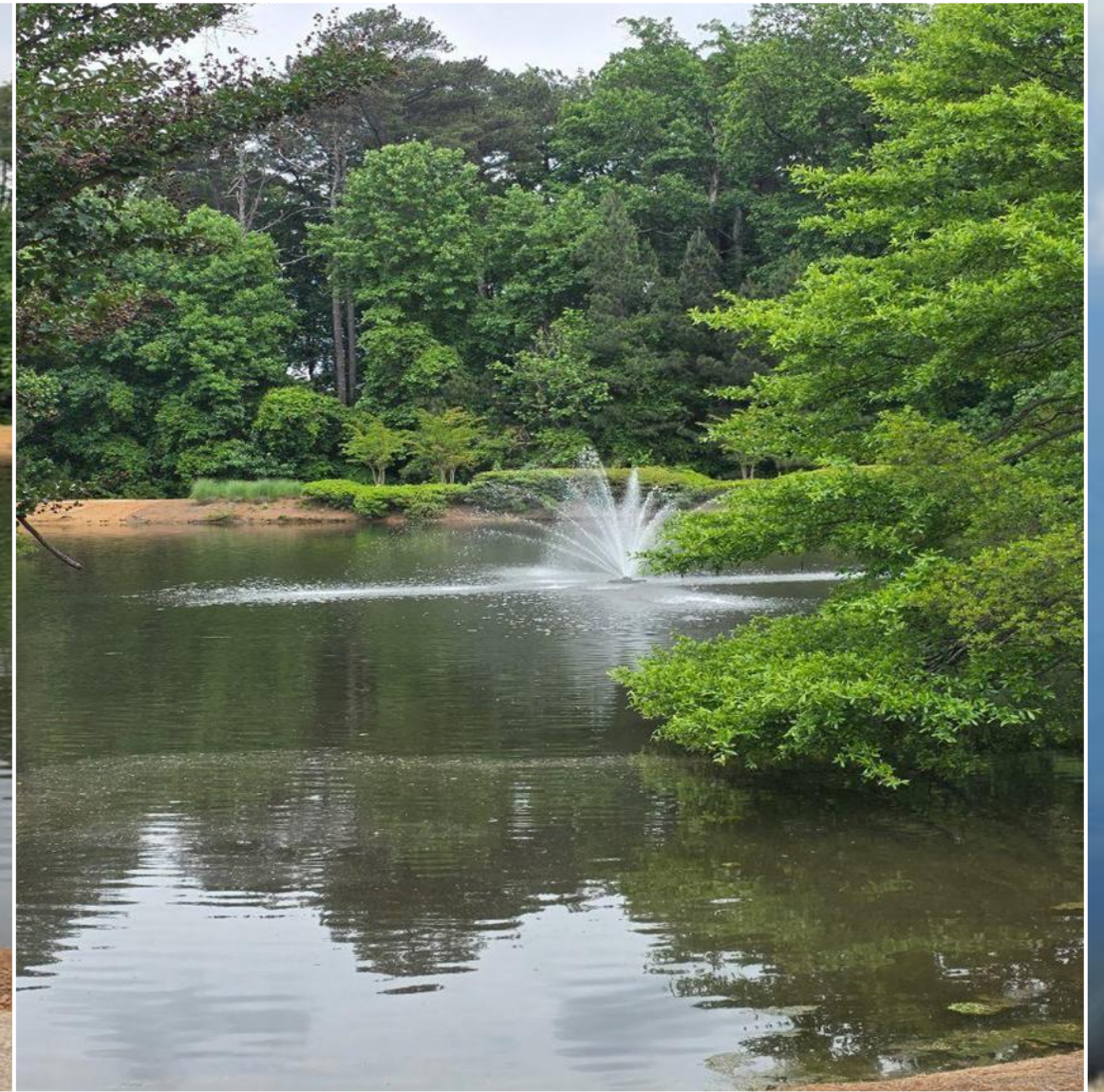
